These are the Original Butterfly Type from Konyenburg & Mark of Holland, the originators of this New Type of Gladiolus, and not a conglomeration of winged type varieties as listed by some growers here on the North American Continent.

- ATTICA 331 Beautiful ruffled deep rosy-pink with yellow throat. Opens 8 on an 18 to 20 bud spike. Midseason. Large each 35¢; Medium each 25¢; Small 2-30¢.
