## The Glory of Early Spring

## How to Select the Proper Daffodils and Narcissi

The term "Narcissus" is actually the Latin or Botanical name for this entire group of plants, whereas "Daffodil" and "Jonquil", as commonly used, are English names referring to certain types. This classification is based on the standards set by the Royal Horticultural Society of England, and primarily consists of differences in length of the Trumpet (Crown or Cup) in relation to the Perianth (the broad expanded portion of the flower).
There is no difference in time of bloom between groups, but varieties within each group will vary - being either early, mid-season or late.

## Fritillaria Meleagris

Here is a race of small bulbous plants that can be grown with ease, free from tribulation and all anxiety to please them. Any welldrained spot, preferably in full sun, satisfies them, and while they revel in a fairly rich soil, they do very nicely in ordinary loam. They increase freely by seed and offsets and last indefinitely, engaging qualities in any bulb. Muscari Botryoides, M. Azureum, and M. Armeniacum are beautiful for growing in pots.

Grape Hyacinths are so very showy, so easy to grow, and naturalize so quickly, that no spring garden is complete without them. Their dainty, diminutive spikes of little bells in bold clusters are just like heaps of sapphires or pearls sparkling in the Spring sunshine.

They are wonderful for Children's Gardens, as they will grow anywhere, no matter how carelessly planted.

Use them very very freely in groups of 3 to 12 bulbs, just as you would Crocus.

Although the graceful Scillas are extremely showy and free flowering, they require no special care or cultivation. In fact, they have become one of our most valuable plant groups for naturalizing and wild gardens because of their ability to thrive under extreme neglect.

Most of the Lilies we offer are easily grown if certain simple requirements are met. In general they like a deep rich loam with perfect drainage. If there is any question about the latter, the beds may be raised two or three inches or the bulbs placed in individual pockets of sand. To keep the hot sun from baking the soil over them, lightly rooting ground covers are essential.

Lilies mature so late in the season that delivery may be delayed until late autumn. As late planting is preferable to spring planting for most varieties, the ground should be protected against freezing by mulching deeply with leaves or other material. A bucket of dry soil stored inside for covering them is a convenience. In no case, should the bulbs remain long unplanted.

Unlike many other bulbous plants, Lilies are not at their best the first year. Only after becoming well established do they begin to produce their finest displays.

## DUTCH IRIS

These exquisite Iris of brilliant colors and superb cut-flower qualities have often been referred to as "the poor man's Orchid". Their ease of culture and low price has brought indescribable beauty to even the tiniest of gardens.

All varieties are easily grown outdoors or forced under glass. Flowers can be cut while in bud, or just on the verge of opening, as they will open well in water and last a great deal longer. In areas where there is a great deal of alternate freezing and thawing it is very advisable to mulch all plantings in the fall to prevent heazing.

This hybrid race was produced by Van Tubergen from hybridization work begun in 1892 with Iris xiphium praecox and other species, and is rapid$l y$ becoming the foremost race of Iris in the country. Striking evidence of its popularity as a cut-flower is the beautiful WEDGEWOOD IRIS so commonly used in florist bouquets. In outdoor gardens they flower two weeks in advance of the Spanish Iris, have much broader, larger petals and are more magnificent in every way.

Years of experimentation have shown they will survive in colder climates if properly mulched and they are rapidly becoming as popular in northern and eastern gardens as they are in California and other warm sections.

Set 5 to 6 inches deep in a warm sunny, well drained location, provide ample water during the spring growing season, and bake thoroughly all summer by withholding all moisture. They are quite tolerant of various soils, but prefer rich soils with fair amount of sand and humus. Height 2 to 3 feet. Flowering season, early June.

All Imported Hyacinths are graded in Holland according to the following sizes $-14 / 15 \mathrm{~cm}$. $-15 / 16 \mathrm{~cm}$. - $16 / 17 \mathrm{~cm}$. $-17 / 18 \mathrm{~cm} .18 / 19 \mathrm{~cm} .-19 \mathrm{~cm}$. and over.

The smallest size $14 / 15 \mathrm{~cm}$. (referred to as Miniature Hyacinths) is generally used for mass display when economy is necessary. Spikes are small, but well formed. By close planting, beautiful effects can be achieved without too much expense.

The next size $15 / 16 \mathrm{~cm}$., is the most popular bedding size as bulbs are still economical in cost but produce larger spikes. Heavy wind and rain storms do not bother them.

The other sizes are used according to size of spike desired and price range.
