## Introducing

I. Fall Fairy—\$5.00—Evelyn Pullar x October Shadows. It increases well if nitrogenous fertilizer is used. Very reliable spring and fall bloomer. Reblooms in September and October here. S-pale lavender fading to white closed. F-deeper lavender slight flare. Good pollen parent. Have number of nice seedlings from use of its pollen.

II. September Sunshine—\$15.00—Double Date x Fall Primrose. S-clear butter yellow addressed. F-flare—deep yellow shading to lighter at edges, orange beard. Styles same color as standards, slight fragrance—9 buds—4 branches, 36 inch stalk. First flower open last September 26. Just a few for sale. Fine tall bearded fall bloomer.

III. Sea Orchid—\$10.00—intermediate border iris late, not a rebloomer-Autumn Twiliaht x Captain Wells (Autumn Twilight x Tinted Porcelain). S-closed rounded waved edges, palest lavender and cream. F-slightly deeper lavender and cream-Brown Veins base of falls, slight flare. Styles same color. Reverse color of falls cream. Substance good. 4 wide branches—7 buds 26 inches. Än orchid in effect—fine stalk, good for border of iris bed.

IV. Chartreuse Chalice—\$20.00—Tinted Porcelain x New Horizon. A chartreuse self -S-addressed chartreuse. F-flare chartreuse brown veins base of falls. Styles same color glistening finish.—Stalk 3 branches well placed, 7 buds—-34 inches tall, beard—orange, substance—fine, slight fragrance—sets seed—a real super iris in a new collector. Not a rebloomer.

August Indian — \$5.00 — Autumn Twilight x Pottawattomi. Stalk 22 inches—3 branches, 6 buds. Flower--S-closed, ecrue color --F-red purple shading to brown at edge ---Center line lighter color. Brown veins base of falls. 1956 bloomed August 19— 1957-September 20.

September Contrast—\$5.00—Fair Day x October Shadows. A neglecta stalk 27 inches —3 branches —7 buds. Flower — S-light blue closed—falls dark blue purple, no flare. Brown veins base of falls, beard yellow—sweet fragrance. September bloom.

September Pastel—\$5.00—October Shadows x Fall Fairy. Stalk 22 inches—3 well placed branches—9 buds. Flower—S-closed pale lavender — Falls a shade darker. A few brown veins base of falls—sweet fragrance a nice pastel coloring—reblooms in September and October.

Fall Primrose — \$5.00 — Autumn Twilight x Redwyne. Stalk 30 inches—4 branches—8 buds—a primrose yellow self. White area at tip of yellow beard — S-closed, F-flare. Blooms here in September and October. One of my best rebloomers. Very reliable and does well everywhere.

Autumn Brown—\$3.00—Autumn Twilight × Western Hills. Stalk 32 inches—4 branches—12 buds. Flower S-light brown closed falls red brown shading to brown at edge. Orange beard. Reblooms in September and

October here. A fine grower.

Summer Surprise—\$3.00 — Autumn Twilight x Hallowe'en Night x Autumn Twilight. Stalk 34 inches—5 branches—20 buds Flower S-ecrue closed, falls-lavender pink, slight flare. Reblooms August and September.

Autumn Afternoon—\$3.00—Sally Anne x Autumn Twilight. Stalk 30 inches—3 branches, flower standards closed—Apricot yellow—falls flaring pink lavender. Reblooms in September and October. Rebloomed ear-

liest and best last summer in dry weather.

Autumn Snowdrift—\$4.00—Tinted Porcelain x Autumn Twilight x Autumn Twilight x Glowport. Stalk 30 inches—3 branches—7 buds, flower S-pure white, addressed falls white slight flare—brown veins base of falls and light lavender veins on falls. Fade to white. Reblooms last of September and October. One of my best introductions.

Green Dragon—\$5.00—October Shadows x Autumn Twilight. Stalk 29 inches — 3 branches, Flower-S-greenish yellow (Chartreuse) color closed—falls veined brown shading to lavender flarings. Fine substance—sets seed freely, slow increase reblooms last of September and October.
