


FOR PERPETUAL BEAUTY

REMEMBER in planning your garden, and with special reference to Peonies, that no Peony in this list has an American Peony Society Rating below 9.0—which is a very high official score. Unattainable perfection in a Peony would win a rating of 10. which never has been known. 9.0 means very superior quality; 8.5 is exceedingly good; 8.0 is high quality; 7.5 is held to be creditable; and only those rated under 7.5 are considered poor. But let me repeat: there is no Peony in this list rated 7.5 or 8.0 or 8.5, but only those rated 9.0 to 9.9. In fact every Peony rated above 9.0 is to be found with this group.

If your house and grounds and gardens are said to reflect the aura of "class," you can best maintain such an enviable reputation by keeping well up to your own standards, and these officially rated Peonies furnish an example of what "certified quality" really means. At present our five most highly approved varieties are "Le Cygne," rated 9.9—so close to perfection!—then "Therese," rated 9.8; "Kelway's Glorious" 9.8; "Solange" 9.7; and "Mrs. A. M. Brand" 9.6.

No investment for your garden will fetch you more satisfying returns than one for Peonies of the quality we maintain. Left undisturbed, perhaps almost neglected in the matter of scientific care, these plants will work out their own destiny and show marvelous growth and improvement for as long a period as a score of years or more, practically on their own!

Botanists in studying the family trees of some of the proud and haughty clans of the garden, have definitely traced the Peony's ancestry to the modest, shy, and highly respectable buttercup of the pastures and meadows; but sophistication and an exalted social position have wrought amazing transformations in the buttercup's city cousins. Under the patient, untiring, and determined attention of horticulturists, the Peonies have attained Royal Rank in the garden, and they are accorded Royal honors and consideration wherever they may appear in the company of horticultural distinction. Make your selections carefully from our list, giving thought and due weight to your preferences in color and form, and if you plant them with due care, and show them a proper respect, you may be reasonably certain of having a garden without regrets, and a family possession that may become a veritable heirloom.


