TERMS. 2\% discount 10 days - Net 60 days from date of invoice for those whose responsibility is known to us. Satisfactory references are required from unknown parties. Interest at $6 \%$ per annum will be charged on overdue accounts.

ORDERS are booked subject to crop conditions or errors in count, and with the understanding that same shall be void should injury befall stock because of hail, fire, frost or other cause beyond our control.

GRADE STANDARDS are those adopted by the American Association of Nurserymen.

PACKING. All boxing or baling charges at cost. No charge is made when stock is packed in bulk in a car.

SHIPPING. In making our Eastern shipments, we use combination or pool cars to several distributing points throughout the East and Middle West. This greatly reduces the freight charges and makes our stock as reasonable as any. L.C.L. railroad freight, auto freight or express shipments promptly handled.

INSPECTION CERTIFICATES will be furnished with each shipment.

CLAIMS for any cause must be made promptly on receipt of shipment. Any stock rejected must be reported immediately and held for advice from us as to disposition but in no case should it be returned to us without authority. We will cheerfully allow credit for proven unsatisfactory stock but will not entertain claims after stock has been once accepted.
