GARDEN SYMPHONY

After an absence of almost two months we resume publication to bring you monthly professional advice and seasonal products. This issue will be devoted primarily to lawns and bulbs.

Fall is the best time to plant new lawns and to repair established lawns. . . Any time after the middle of August. . . Good lawns are made not born. . . The quality of your lawn depends upon the soil preparation before planting, the seed which you plant and the care which you give your lawn afterward. . . Price will depend on quality and the kind of seed. . . Check the analysis label and talk to a professional salesperson before deciding. . . Buy the best seed available for your purpose!

If you are establishing a new lawn, the first step is a soil analysis to determine what nutrients your soil will need to produce the best possible lawn. . . You can do this yourself by purchasing a soil test kit or merely take a soil sample to your County Agent. . . Then plow, rototill or spade the area removing all large stones, roots and other debris. . . Level the area at the same time and rough grade it so that drainage will be away from the house. . . At the same time work in limestone, organic matter, (Peat Moss or Manure) and about half of the fertilizer. . . Spread them evenly and work into the soil to a depth of approximately six inches. . . Then a preliminary raking is necessary to distribute the balance of the fertilizer and to remove small surface stones. . . This establishes a good seed bed. . . Distribute the seed by mechanical spreader or broadcast by hand, after dividing the seed into two parts. . . Spread the first part while working in one direction and spread the second part at right angles to the first.

After the seed has been spread, it should be raked in lightly and then rolled to make good contact with the soil. . . Keep the seed bed moist with light frequent watering. . . A covering of Baccto Michigan Peat will help to maintain a uniform moist condition during this critical period and prevent seed from being washed away by heavy rains or heavy sprinkling. Do not cut grass the first time until it is about two inches tall and be sure to use a very sharp mower. . . Wait until the season after seeding before applying weed killers.

Every lawn requires care and maintenance to preserve its beauty. . . This means fertilization, proper cutting and weed control. . . Most home lawns suffer from being underfed and require a fertilizer like Agrico for Lawns in the Spring and in the Fall. . . The Fall application should be the major feeding. . . This is the time to apply a complete fertilizer and additional nitrogen in the form of a slower available organic material like Agrinite. . . Too much readily available nitrogen may do more harm than good. . . Proper watering is extremely important and must be considered in terms of weather conditions. . . Blue Grass and Fescues will prosper better if watered deeply and less frequently. . . Cutting should take place as frequently as necessary to maintain height of grass between 1½ to 2 inches. . . Broadleaf weed control can be obtained, without harming grasses, with any product containing 2, 4-D or 2, 4, 5, -T. . . This lawn information necessarily has to be general in nature but, again, we suggest you bring your lawn and garden problems to us for specific information and professional assistance.

And now to consider the other major lawn and garden item for the Fall. . . Flowering bulbs. . . Flowering bulbs are seeds. . . Large seeds containing all of the nutrients necessary for the maturing of the plants. . . The larger the seed, the larger the bloom, the sturdier the stem and root system. . . **THE SIZE OF THE BULB IS IN DIRECT PROPORTION TO THE SIZE AND QUALITY OF THE PLANT AND BLOOM.**

There has been much misleading information about flowering Tulip bulbs. . . Because size is directly related to quality, much of the misleading information comes from describing Tulip bulbs as "top size", "giant size", "first quality", "first size", "special size",

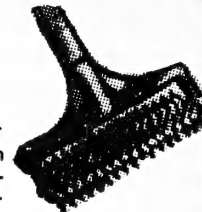

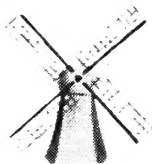

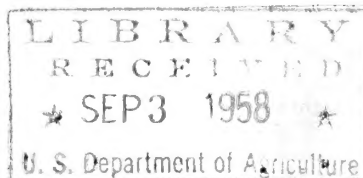
