A sweep of Narcissus across a meadow, under trees, or along a stream makes a breathtaking picture in Spring, but two cautions should be used in planting them: Never mix varieties, and do not plant where the grass has to be cut before the Narcissus foliage dies. Each is a mother bulb which will produce two to four stems.

It you are estatistiog a sem lase, the first step is a soil asalysis to determine wht matrients yout soil will seed to prodece the best possiale lawa. You can do this pourselt by purchasing a seil test hit of metcly take s soil sample to yout Cousty Atest. . Then plow, rototill of spade the ares reneving all lage stones, foots and other debris. . Level the ares at the sane time and rongt trade it so that draisate will be away fros the bouse At the same time asch io limestone, organic natter, (Peat Moss or Manare) and about halt of the fertiliset. Spreat then evesly and wart into the seil to a fepth of appratimately sit inches. . Then a prolimieary raking is eecessary to distribute the balance of the fertr. lizet and to renove snall sefface stones. . This ostablishes a tood seed bed... Distribute the sed by mechanical spreadet of broadcast by basd, affer dividing the setd ieto tac parts. . Sprent the first purt ebile sarking is one firection and spreat the second oart at right megies to the first.

After the seed tas been soreat, it should be raked in lightly asd then rolled to mak cood contact with the sail. . Keep the reed bet moist with light freguent watering. . A covering of Baccto Michigan Peat will helo to maimais a veiforn moist condition daring this critical period and provent sed fron being wasbed pway by bery faim or hervy sprisiling. Do not cot fuss the first time eatil it is asoot too isches tall and be sure to ase a very 3harp mowet. . Wait astil the season after seedisg before applying weed killers.

Broadea! weed control can be obtained, withoot harniag grasmes, with any prodect contaising 2. 4.0 or 2, 4, 5, -T. .. This lawn infornation aecessmily kas to be teseral in atere but, agais we sugtest you brisg your lros and garden probiens to os for specific isformation and professional assistance.

Aad sow to consider the other major lawn and gardes iter for the Fall... Flowering bulbs. . Flowering bulas are seeds. . Large seeds containing all of the mutripets seces sary for the rataring of the plants. The larger the seed, the lager the bloon, the stardiel the sten and root systen. . THE SIZE OF THE BULB IS IN OIRECT PROPORTION TO THE SIZE AND QUALITY OF THE PLANT AND BLOON

There tas bees mach misleating isformation abost flowering Tulio bulbs. . Becsase size is directly related to quality, much of the misleading isformation comps from desctibing Tulip bulbs as "foo size", "tiant size". "first quality", "first size", "special size"
