A brand new creation of the Armstrong Research Department, it is a cross between the large-flowered Camellia japonica and the little known Camellia saluenensis. The happy result is one of the most beautiful and useful garden shrubs imaginable. It grows readily in sun or in full shade and with a bit of pruning you can easily train it into almost any desired shape-even into an attractive espalier against a wall. A dense mantle of big shining leaves holds its rich dark green color 365 days of the year.
