## ORCHARD FRUITS

While commercial orchardists must follow certain procedures for profitable operation of large scale fruit production, the home orchard will produce satisfactory remeraber, however, that the more closely you follow good
orchard practices the higher the quality and greater your
productivity will be.
LOCATION AND PLANTING. Fruit trees do best in soil of medium texture. If possible, avoid light sand or gravel, as well as heavy clay or muck. Select a location that is dead air pockets and damage from late spring frosts is much less likely. Follow the same planting methods as for Shade Trees or Shrubs. Proper pruning at the time of planting is more important than many realize as it can determine either good or bad results in later years. (See
illustration) The following distances are for orchard planting to give maximum production. Where space is limited, trees may be set closer and still produce a satisfactory crop. Apples 35 ft., Sour Cherries 20
St., Pears 20 ft .
POLLINATION. Most fruit trees should be provided with another variety of the same type to produce maximum crops. If not nractical, enough fruit for home use may still be produced. If your neighbor has an Apple Tree of another variety, Sour Cherries and many of the Peaches are entirely self-fruitful when standing alone but Apples, Plums, Pears and Sweet Cherries need pollinizers
SPRAYING. A regular program is almóst necessary to keep trees vigorous and healthy and produce insect-free truit. While the commercial orchardist uses many dif to use an "All Purpose". spray; Spraying times vary so much in different parts of the country that we could not attempt to furaish even a condensed chart. Your County can furnish you with a spray "calendar" for your own district.
