
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

INTRODUCTIONS FOR 1959

KISSIN' KIN

(O. Brown '59) T.B., Height 34". Mid-season. (Sib. to "Country Cuzzin") Large nicely ruffled white with excellent substance. The standards are domed and falls are semi-flaring with small area of gold on shoulders. A bright tangerine beard adorns the wide falls. Branching is good and plants are vigorous. Sdlg. No. 6-15A5. Pictured on cover.

MELODY ROSE

(O. Brown '59) T.B., Height 36". Mid-season. (Pink sdlg.)x(Cloud Cap) X Picture Bouquet. Orchid-pink (between Fuchsine pink and Persian-Rose-(Wilson) is the color of this delightful iris. Lovely formed flowers with horizontal falls and a carrot-red beard. Sdlg. No. 6-16B.

TANTALLON

(O. Brown '59) T.B., Height 36"-Mid-season. Parentage involves a third generation (Pink sdlg)X Picture Bonquet. Standards are Marigold Orange. The wide, flaring falls are Nasturtium Orange with a Burnt Orange beard. Numerous blooms of good substance are carried on well branched stalks. Most attractive color when used with blues and dark violets. Sdlg. No. 6-13E1.

Named for "Tantallon"—the "diggins" of a good friend and fellow irisarian— Bruce Hood, of Orange, New South Wales, Australia. The original Tantallon being a centuries old castle near the ancestral home in Scotland.

INNOMINATA-DOUGLASIANA HYBRIDS
