We also are proud to introduce a new Burr Patent, namely, "Cherry Glow", which is one of the new Grandiflora class with a deep cherry and rose red color. It is a luscious, full blossomed rose with a spicy fragrance. We also have a complete line of the more popular flowering shrubs.

We expect an exceptionally fine crop of ornamental trees this year. The Maples, Flowering Crabs and Mountain Ash are outstanding values and we have a good supply. In lesser supply, but excellent trees, are such popular ornamentals as Paul's Scarlet Hawthorne, Kwanzan Cherry, and Purple Leaf Plum.
