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
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Plants of the Seven Devils Mountains of Idaho—An Annotated Checklist

THE AUTHOR

RICHARD T. (DICK) BINGHAM retired from the Intermountain Station in 1974, after 34 years with the Forest Service. The greater part of his research career was spent leading a successful, 25-year program of breeding for blister rust resistance in western white pine. This work is summed up in his General Technical Report INT-146, "Blister Rust Resistant Western White Pine for the Inland Empire," 1978, and in American Forests, December 1984, "New Beginning for the Western White Pine," by Louise Kingsbury. Since retirement, Dick has continued to work as a Forest Service volunteer, both for the Intermountain Station and the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area. In this capacity, he has coauthored two local plant floras written for the NRA--with D. M. Henderson of the University of Idaho, a "Guide to the Common Plants of Hells Canyon" (1978), and with C. J. Miller, Forest Service volunteer from St. Maries, ID, a "Guide to the Common Plants of the Seven Devils Mountains" (in press).

RESEARCH SUMMARY

The author has assembled a checklist of 722 plant taxa found above 5,000 ft elevation in the Seven Devils Mountains and along the Wild River Corridor of the Rapid River of west-central Idaho. This list is based on the author's and Clyde J. Miller's tield work and on data compiled from the labels of specimens of seven regional herbaria, altogether representing 45 individuals who collected plants in the Seven Devils Mountains between 1899 and 1984. The checklist rates taxa for frequency of occurence and general geographic and elevational distribution.

The checklist includes annotations for almost 2,700 plant collections from the Seven Devils and deposited in seven Inland Northwest herbaria (BKR, BOIS, Council R.D., ID, IDF, OGDF, and WS; see text, table 2). Each plant collection cited is accompanied by the following annotations: collector's name, his or her accession number, herbarium of deposition, specific locality and elevational data, and habitat information where available from the herbarium label.

The checklist will be of interest to vegetation managers and researchers, including systematic botanists, forest ecologists, silviculturists, range conservationists, and those who monitor rare plants.

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INTRODUCTION

During the summers from 1977 through 1983, the author and fellow Forest Service volunteer Clyde J. Miller (formerly of the St. Joe National Forest) traveled most of the trails and roads of west-central Idaho's Seven Devils Mountains—observing, collecting, and identifying the plants found there. The first objective of this pleasant work has been to produce a layman's guide to the common plants of these scenic, wilderness mountains, and this goal is largely in hand, with the completion of the manuscript "Guide to the Common Plants of the Seven Devils Mountains," submitted to the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area in February 1983. A second objective has been to provide a solid foundation—this checklist—toward a technical and complete flora of the Seven Devils Mountains.

For purposes of this checklist, the Seven Devils Mountains include those forest and grass lands lying above 5,000 ft elevation along the divide between the Snake River on the west and the Salmon, Little Salmon, or Weiser rivers on the east, from Camp Howard (5 mi southwest of White Bird, ID, lat. 45° 43' N.) on the north, to Sheep Peak, also known as Sheep Mountain, on the south but not Sheep Rock (5 mi south-southeast of the Snake River Oxbow and 11/2 mi northwest of the Wildhorse River, lat. 44° 54' N.). (See Nez Perce National Forest map.) More specifically, proceeding southward and clockwise from Camp Howard Cow Camp along its east side, the study area is defined by Big Canyon Saddle, Grave Point, Cow Creek Saddle, Buckhorn Spring, Papoose Saddle, Aitken Spring, Rattlesnake Spring, Lockwood Point, Campbell Cow Camp, Pollock Mountain, Ant Butte, Lick Creek Lookout, Huckleberry Camp, heads of Grouse and Fawn Creeks, and the divides between Bear and Indian Creeks, then the Wildhorse and Snake Rivers to Sheep Peak (or Sheep Mountain) on the south. Then going north along its west side, the study area is defined by Horse Mountain, Lockwood Saddle, Kinney Point, Sheep Rock, Cliff Mountain, Granite Mountain, the west side of Potato Hill, Timbered Bench, Three Creek Point, Dry Diggins Lookout, McGaffee Cow Camp, Low Saddle, Sawpit Saddle, Forest Service road 2060, Kirkwood Corrals, Dixon Corrals, and Wild Horse Butte back to Camp Howard.

This often narrow strip of extremely rough and broken country runs for about 60 mi north and south but averages less than 5 mi wide east and west (from less than 1 mi to more than 13 mi). Most of it lies within the Hells Canyon Wilderness of the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area, while perhaps a third of it, on the north, east, and south, falls in the Slate-Salmon Ranger District of the Nez Perce National Forest or in the Council Ranger District of the Payette National Forest. Also included is the Rapid River Wild River Corridor, running between 2,200 and 7,400 ft in elevation, upstream from the Circle C State Fish Hatchery. Most of the typically low-elevation plant taxa in the checklist were found along trail 113 in the lower Rapid River Corridor. Probably fewer than 5 mi² of private lands are included—patented mining claims or high grazing lands, the latter almost exclusively on the south.

This checklist includes 722 plant taxa, 293 genera, and 71 families, represented by 2,700 different, mounted herbarium collections and 5,470 sight records made by experienced observers. The checklist has been assembled over 4 years, as follows:

1. A core list of about 535 taxa was developed using the field collection notes of four contemporary collectors, or parties of collectors. The list included 500 taxa from the 620 collections and 3,600 sight records of Bingham and Miller, and 35 additional taxa from the 74 collections and 123 sight records of D. M. Henderson, E. W. Tisdale, and C. A. Wellner (see table 1 for more information on these collectors).

2. The 535-taxon list then was checked through the three local herbaria (the University of Idaho Herbarium, acronym ID; the University of Idaho College of Forestry, Wildlife and

Range Sciences Research Herbarium, IDF; and the Marion Ownbey Herbarium of Washington State University, WS). These herbarium searches provided much more information confirming the presence of the 535 taxa and extending their known distributions in the Seven Devils. More importantly, it uncovered the names of many others who had collected in the Seven Devils.

3. Notable among these collectors were four botanists whose collections, as found in the herbaria, could be augmented with additional collections reported in their field collection notes. These botanists were John H. Christ of the Soil Conservation Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture (collection ledgers at ID, 435 collections); William H. Baker, former Director, ID (accession books at ID, 219 collections); Harold St. John, Professor of Botany at Washington State [then] College and author of the "Flora of Southeastern Washington and Adjacent Idaho" (1937) (photocopies of Seven Devils field collection notes obtained by correspondence with St. John, 176 collections); and Jacqueline Packard, Washington State College botany graduate student (fragmentary field collection notes obtained by correspondence with Mrs. Jacqueline Packard Moore, 123 collections). These 950 collections included 130 additional taxa, which when checked through the three local herbaria, generated additional names and collections.

4. In addition to the eight collectors or collection parties above, successive herbarium searches, including those at BOIS and OGDF, generated the names of another 37 collectors or parties (table 1). All but two (E. C. Johnson and L. Howell, each having made only one known collection) were located. Thus 35 additional field collection records might be accessible, either through personal correspondence, or if deceased (11 collectors), through an agency. Aided by Steiber's (1982)¹ register of collector's field notes, inquiries were mailed to 34 collectors, their agencies, or herbaria. This effort produced the following results: photocopies of pertinent field notes for 12 collectors; evidence that field records had not been made or had been lost for 10 collectors; a reconstruction of the collection record for four collectors (Baird, Brewer, McDowell, and Simon) by complete searches of the Council R.D. and BKR herbaria; no answers from four presumably living collectors; and inquiries still underway with five collectors.

These inquiries and resultant copies of field records generated the few remaining (17) taxa of the checklist. The 45 individuals or parties known to have collected in the Seven Devils Mountains are listed in table 1, along with summary information on their collections, affiliated herbaria, and places of work.

The 722 taxa checklisted include 72 (10.0 percent) represented only by sight records, which are visual records made by several different plant collectors. Sight records indicate that a given plant was believed to occur, on a given date, on a given sample plot, a section of a road or trail, or in the plant community near a collected plant. Such records are included to cover plant taxa not represented by mounted herbarium collections, to augment the record for rare or scarce taxa, and to contribute to the general statement about the frequency and distribution of each taxon. The preponderance of the sight records came from the sample plot work of Edwin W. Tisdale, emeritus professor of range management at the University of Idaho College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences; from Charles G. Johnson, Jr., plant ecologist, Wallowa-Whitman National Forest; from Robert Steele, plant ecologist, Intermountain Research Station, Boise, ID; and the trail and roadside surveys of Bingham and Miller as made for their layman's flora of the Seven Devils. The 5,463 sight records are summarized below:

Accuracy of the identity of collections and sight records undoubtedly varies with the training and experience of the collector or observer, and the expertise the collector enlisted in confirming identifications. In terms of reliability of identification, the collections would rank as follows:

1. Collections identified or verified by specialists in the particular families, sections, or genera.

2. The more recently identified collections (say post-1975) that have been accepted by a recognized herbarium, for the identity of almost all of these are now verified by well-trained taxonomists before being deposited in the herbarium. For example, the 1977-83 collections of Wellner, Henderson, Tisdale, and Bingham and Miller were all verified by such taxonomists.

3. The pre-1975 collections found in recognized herbaria.

4. Collections identified by the collector only in his field notes and not seen or found recorded elsewhere by the author.

5. Mostly unsupported sight records.

Undoubtedly some of the unseen collections are incorrectly identified by the collector in his or her field notes, and they will have been reidentified by taxonomists at the various herbaria. This checklist includes only a few such reidentifications where known to the author through correspondence or through his examination of reidentified collections in the various herbaria searched. The checklist also includes at least 20 taxa that are of questionable identity because they fall outside the known distribution of the taxa. These "offrange" taxa, as well as about 10 other taxa of uncertain identity, are indicated by a question mark preceding the Latin name.

Field notes also vary widely in quality. Christ, for instance, provided only skimpy habitat and locality data for his collections. But he was meticulous in updating his field notes following confirmation of the identity of many of his plants, recording them by collection numbers in a separate set of beautifully handwritten ledgers. Field notes of other collectors, however, commonly included plants known to have been misidentified, numbered plants identified only as to genus, and even unidentified plants.

This checklist includes more than 100 collections by seven different collectors who merely dated, and did not number, their collections. In many cases it has been possible to definitely recognize these dated collections by substituting a given herbarium's number for the miss-ing collector's number, as follows: Aldrich 7/4/07, ID 7824, and so forth. These unnumbered collections undoubtedly occur under different numbers in other herbaria.

Henderson, Kruckeberg, and Wellner (table 1) each entered a few sight records in the course of recording data on other plant collections. In this checklist, about half of the taxa represented by sight records alone are the often-ignored and seldom-collected, common and introduced weeds, or low-elevation taxa seen by Bingham and Miller along the Rapid River.

Checklist Format

Plant taxa are checklisted alphabetically, first by family names, then by genus, species, subspecies, and variety, all in Latin. (Phylogenetic arrangement of families is not attempted.) Latin names are followed by the authorities (usually abbreviated) and the taxon's common name, amplified as necessary to distinguish subspecies and varieties. Latin names and most of the common names follow "Flora of the Pacific Northwest, an Illustrated Manual" (Hitchcock and Cronquist 1973), except as follows: For the Artemisia tridentata varieties see Winward and Tisdale (1977), for the Hieracium species and varieties of Section Thyrsoidea see Deardorff (1977), for the Poa sandbergii (or P. secunda) complex see Arnow (1981) or Kellogg (1983), for the North American Salix species of Section Cordatae see Dorn (1975), and for the Thlaspi fendleri (or T. montanum) complex see Holmgren (1971).

Next follows a general statement covering the relative frequency of the taxon and outlining its locality and elevational distribution, based on all known collections and sight records. Relative frequency of a taxon is given in terms of the number of known occurrences (collections and/or sight records), as follows:

Rare—currently listed by Steele and others (1981) among endangered, threatened, or plants of concern in Idaho, not exotics.

Scarce—only one or two known occurrences, often because the taxon normally occurs at elevations either lower or higher than found in the Seven Devils Mountains.

Occasional—three to four known occurrences, sometimes because it usually occurs at lower or higher elevations.

Uncommon-five to nine known occurrences.

Frequent-10 to 19 known occurrences.

Common-20 to 39 known occurrences.

Abundant-40 or more known occurrences.

Elevations do not apply to the Rapid River unless the plant was collected or seen only there. General localities are given as northern Seven Devils (north of Crater Lake), central Seven Devils (Crater Lake south to Emerald Lake), southern Seven Devils (south of Emerald Lake), and Rapid River (lower and west fork along trail 113 up to Rankin Mill). Occasionally, in successively numbered collections, the locality and elevational information has been inferred from the collector's field notes for previously or subsequently numbered collections.

Next follows a list, alphabetically by collector's names and then numerically by collector's numbers, of all known collections of the taxon. As mentioned above, sight records may be included in certain cases, and their number is included in most cases. Each collection number is followed by the abbreviations (table 2) for the herbaria known or assumed to hold the collection, and is accompanied by a brief description of habitat, locality, elevation, and date of the collection, as available from notes and herbarium label.

A single asterisk preceding the collector's name signifies a collection known only from the collector's field notes, and identified there only by the collector. In most cases it is known that the collectors deposited specimens of given periods in certain herbaria, while in other cases a collector donated or sold part or all of his personal herbarium to a particular institutional herbarium. For instance, the Washington State University botanists St. John, Meyer, Packard, Comstock, Aase, Munro, Jones, and others are known to have deposited their Seven Devils plant collections in the Ownbey Herbarium at that institution, while Christ, late in his life, is known to have sold his principal and personal collection to the


New York Botanical Garden. In cases where the author has not seen the collection, but has assumed it to be deposited in a given herbarium, or where the collection has not been seen because it is out on loan or lost from a local herbarium, the herbarium acronym is preceded by a question mark. These collections then appear in the checklist as follows: *Christ 12733, ?NY,*

Where locality may have been refined, updated, and amplified by the author, such information is enclosed in parentheses. Local or obsolete place names appearing more than twice in this checklist are defined below. Interpretation of most of these names was provided for the central Seven Devils by Ace (Ralph A.) Barton of Riggins, ID, or by Earl E. or Esther C. Hibbs of Pullman, WA, and for the southern Seven Devils by Walter W. Pierson, one of the range management veterans still with the Payette National Forest, McCall, ID.

- "Brundage Trail"—a name used by Packard (1937 and 1938 collections) that refers to the original (and several-times-relocated) Forest Service trail 112, as located and partly constructed by Ranger Lew Bundige about 1911. The misspelling is Packard's.
- "Camp Howard, 5,000 ft" of Aldrich (Colls. of 1907), probably refers to the general area of the Camp Howard Cow Camp in the headwaters of Getta Creek on Camp Howard Ridge about 5 mi west-southwest of the town of White Bird, ID. The present Cow Camp lies at 5,700 ft elevation.
- "Dry Diggins" or "Dry Diggins Area" referred to by St. John and Mullen (Colls. of 1927), Packard (Colls. of 1937 and 1938), Nelson and Nelson (Colls. of 1938), Esther Hibbs (Colls. of 1937), and Kruckeberg (Colls. of 1952) is a name conferred by the early stockmen. It refers to a mostly lava-capped plateau extending southwest from the south end of Dry Diggins Ridge and Lily Pad Lake toward Hibbs Cow Camp along the divide between Bernard Creek to the northwest and the west fork of Sheep Creek or Little Granite Creek to the southeast. It does not refer to the area around Jack Hasting's Dry Diggins Ridge mining claim to the north along trail 140, nor to the area in the immediate vicinity of Dry Diggins Lookout.
- "Dry Diggins Camp" or "Dry Diggins Ranger Station" as referred to by Nelson and Nelson (Colls. of 1938), apparently was a name coined on the spot and it cannot be located. This place (or places) may have been a temporary lookout, fire camp, or fencing camp. It was not Dry Diggins Lookout because the Nelsons collected there and specifically identified the lookout.
- "Granite Creek, White Cabin" of Ranger Brewer (Colls. of 1928), may refer to a whitepainted cabin or one occupied by a person named White. The site is one of the abandoned cabins at or near Deb's Corral at the junction of trails 192 and 189, just east of Granite Creek and Stevens Saddle, but in the head of the west fork of the Rapid River; or it is some unknown cabin on the Granite Fork of the Lake Fork of the main Rapid River, possibly lying along either Black Lake road 112 or the Lake Fork trail 188. Brewer's data as to General Land Office sections, townships, and ranges often were in error. Here he gave the locality either as sec. 11, T. 22 N., R. 2 W., or as sec. 10, T. 22 N., R. 3 W.
- "Heavens Gate" of Ownbey and Meyer (Colls. of 1940), Aase (Colls. of 1940), Davis (Colls. of 1940), and to some extent Baker (Colls. of 1954) and Christ (Colls. of 1941), may include part or even all of the ridge along the Snake-Salmon Rivers divide between Windy Saddle and Heavens Gate Lookout.
- "Horse Heaven Saddle" of Bingham and Miller (Colls. of 1980 and 1981) is the author's name for the somehow unnamed but major saddle at the heads of Two Creek and the north fork of Mill Creek, where the Old Boise Trail joins trails 114 and 124 about one-fourth mi north of Horse Heaven Lookout cabin.
- "Iron Springs Ranger Station or Camp" of Brewer (Colls. of 1928) was an early Forest Service camp located at the spring about 0.2 mi north of Holbrook Saddle near the junction of trails 190 and 191. According to Walter Pierson it was not at the site of the old town of Iron Springs on upper Paradise Creek.
- "Jackley Guard Station or Guard Camp" of Brewer (Colls. of 1930) was a tent camp located near Jackley Mountain.
- "Krammer, or Krammer Cabins" of Brewer (Colls. of 1929) apparently was near the junction of roads 105 and 112, about 1¹/₄ mi north of Bear Guard Station. This was the Kramer (stage) station discussed by Pam Gardner (March 1986) in the Forest Service Region Four Intermountain Reporter.

- "Patrolman Creek" of Brewer (Colls. of 1928) was a small and now apparently unnamed creek lying to the north of Jackley Mountain and probably draining into Oxbow Creek and the west fork of the Rapid River.
- "Rapid River Trail" of the Nelsons (Colls. of 1938) could be their name for the main Rapid River trail 113, or for any of the trails (55, 61, and 62) which parallel the river or leave the west fork to climb up to the Old Boise Trail, above.
- "Seven Devils Camp" of Christ (Colls. of 1941) and Baker (Colls. of 1954) was the old unimproved campsite at the former terminus of road 517 at Windy Saddle. The presentday camp (as referred to by Bingham and Miller 1979, 1981; or LaZelle 1963) was not constructed until about 1959-62.
- "Seven Devils Forest Station" of Kruckeberg (Colls. of 1952) or "Administrative Site" of LaZelle (Colls. of 1963) was the present-day Guard Station about one-fourth mi southeast of Windy Saddle.
- "Seven Devils Ridge" of Christ (Colls. of 1941) apparently is a name coined by Christ and defies interpretation. It could be either the ridge between Windy Saddle and Heavens Gate Lookout or the ridge along the divide between Bridge and the west fork of Sheep Creeks. From Christ's other collections of the same day near Seven Devils Lake, it would appear to be the latter.
- "Sheep Creek" of Davis (Colls. of 1940), "Headwaters of Sheep Creek" of Ownbey and Meyer (Colls. of 1940), and "Sheep Creek Trail" of Christ (Colls. of 1941) all refer to the east and west forks of Sheep Creek where traversed by trail 112 between Windy Saddle and the south end of Dry Diggins Ridge.
- "Sheep Creek Lakes No. 1 to 4" of Packard (Colls. of 1937), Christ (Colls. of 1941), and Kruckeberg (Colls. of 1952) are names reflecting the fact that—aside from Lily Pad Lake-the lakes in the head of the west fork of Sheep Creek which, although mapped, remained unnamed until the early 1940's (see portion of Packard's 1931 Nez Perce NF map, fig. 1a). Ace Barton says (Barton 1984): "There was no trail into Sheep Lake at that Time, just a way through. My folks and the Hibbs got to calling the lakes 1-4 and the name stayed until Lithicum did his survey in the Forties. As far as I know he named them with the present day names. ... The numbers corresponded with lakes as you came on them from the Dry Diggins side." Thus as one proceeded south from Lily Pad Lake, alongside or across "The Swamps" (see below) on some forerunner of trail 123, Basin Lake became Lake No. 1, Shelf Lake No. 2, and Gem Lake No. 3. Apparently the other two lakes (Rock Island and Appendix) above Gem Lake in the very head of the west fork of the west fork of Sheep Creek were hidden from view on the old trail 123 (as with the present trail), and thus were not numbered. The trail then crossed the divide between the east fork and the west fork of the west fork of Sheep Creek, and descended to Lake No. 4 (Sheep Lake).
- "Sheep Peak or Rock" of Brewer (Colls. of 1928) is the 5,257-ft Sheep Peak (or Mountain) lying about 1¼ mi northwest of the Wildhorse River and about 5 mi south-southeast of the Snake River Oxbow. It is not the present-day Sheep Rock at the northern terminus of road 106, about 7 mi north of Cuprum.
- "Squaw Creek" of Meyer (Colls. of 1937), Moore (Colls. of 1936), Munro (Colls. of 1937), Packard (Colls. of 1936), Peters (Colls. of 1936), and St. John and Mullen (Colls. of July 17-19, 1927) is an old name now changed to Bernard Creek to avoid confusion with the Squaw Creek entering the Little Salmon River just south of Riggins.
- "The Swamps" of Packard (Colls. of 1937), E. Hibbs (Colls. of 1937), and Christ (Colls. of 1941) is another well-deserved name conferred by the early stockmen to the long and often very wet sedge meadow lying along the west side of present trail 123 between Lily Pad and Basin Lakes.

The checklist includes 13 of Idaho's rare plants, so designated by Idaho's official rare plant group, The Rare and Endangered Plant Technical Committee of the Idaho Natural Areas Council. These rare plants are identified by a double asterisk preceding the Latin name. Among the 13 rare plants, two have been recommended for the Federal-Threatened category. These plants are rare in the United States and likely to become endangered due to declining populations or to the likelihood that their habitat area will decrease under present land use or management practices. Another six plants are recommended for a "Federal Watch List," and another five plants for a "State Watch List." These are plants the Committee feels should be monitored. They are rare, either in the United States or in the State of Idaho, even though not now threatened unless major changes occur in the management of lands where they occur. See Steele and others (1981, rev. 1983) for more

details on the status and distribution of these rare plants. Seventeen other plants, previously considered as potentially rare, currently are known to range in frequency from fairly common to scarce and are not designated otherwise (see Henderson and others 1977).

Last, the checklist includes 52 plants introduced from Eurasia. These are identified as to continent of origin by parenthetical notes following the common name. The introductions make up just over 7 percent of the Seven Devils Mountains flora.

GEOLOGICAL HISTORY AND GEOLOGY OF THE SEVEN DEVILS MOUNTAINS

Some 14 to 17 million years ago in the Miocene Geologic Period two extensive and now rather well-defined basalts were extruded from a volcanic chain located near the junction of Washington and Oregon with Idaho. These were the older Imnaha and the younger Grande Ronde Basalts, and they spread to cover most of the southeastern portion of the ancestral Columbia River Basin, including the ancestral Snake River and its tributary Salmon, Little Salmon, and Weiser River drainages (Hooper 1982). Then, probably about 11 to 13 million years ago (still in the Miocene) the Seven Devils, Wallowas, Owyhees, and other mountain ranges ringing the upper Snake River Basin were uplifted, trapping the Snake River and backing it up to form ancestral Lake Idaho (Livingston 1928). The rising lake, which stretched from Oxbow to Twin Falls, may for a time have drained westward through southern Oregon or farther to the south through Nevada and northern California. Eventually, however, it found a northerly outlet near Oxbow. Then in only the last 2 million years the new Snake River, following a series of north-south fault lines, very rapidly cut down the magnificent, present-day Hells Canyon (Wheeler and Cook 1954). This process was greatly hastened by Pleistocene-Era glaciation of 1 to 2 million years ago.

To the northwest and west of the Seven Devils in the northern Blue Mountains and often-plateaued Wallowa Mountains, and to the south in the smaller and lower, plateaued Cuddy Mountains, the uplifted basalt cap often remains in place over fairly large areas between 6,000 and 8,000 ft elevation (Livingston 1928). This is not the case, however, in the much narrower and consequently much more severely eroded Seven Devils Mountains. Exemplifying the severity of this erosional stress, a 13-mi east-west transect through 9,393-ft He Devil Mountain rises 7,000 ft in 7 mi from the Rapid River on the east, and then falls 8,000 ft in 6 mi into Hells Canyon on the west. Under these conditions it is easy to visualize the erosional undermining and removal of most of the basalt cap from atop the central Seven Devils. In areas of lesser uplifting and erosional stress, as, for instance, in the northern Seven Devils at 5,000 to 6,000 ft along the Snake-Salmon Rivers divide between Buckhorn Spring and Camp Howard Triangulation Station, the basalt mantle has yet to be eroded away. Continuous stretches of Imnaha Basalt, occasionally overlain by the younger Grande Ronde Basalt, remain in place along that divide today. Similarly, in the southern Seven Devils, some fairly large or continuous areas of these same basalts are found in two general areas. One of these areas is along the Snake-Weiser Rivers divide on either side of the Black Lake road near Placer Basin. Here, at 5,500 to 6,500 ft, the younger and higher Grande Ronde Basalt, if ever there, is gone, but the older and lower Imnaha Basalt remains atop several half-square-mile to square-mile areas. And in the other area farther to the south and west, on the 4,500- to 5,200-ft plateaued ridges constituting the Indian Creek-Snake River and the Wildhorse-Snake Rivers divides from west of Cuprum on the north to Sheep Peak (not Rock) on the south, even the Grande Ronde Basalt remains uneroded atop the older Imnaha Basalt.

Only one, perhaps third-square-mile, patch of Imnaha Basalt (severely weathered) remains in the central Seven Devils—on the 7,300- to 7,600-ft plateau which forms the Bernard Creek-Little Granite Creek divide and lying between the junction of trails 112 and 140 (south end of Dry Diggins Ridge one-half mile north of Lily Pad Lake on the northeast) and trails 112 and 56 about one-fourth mile north-northeast of Hibbs Cow Camp (Gaston and Bennett 1979). This remnant of basalt is the substrate for one of the few disjunct plant communities of the Seven Devils. This is the only central Seven Devils locality where one finds dagger pod (*Phoenicaulis cheiranthoides* Nutt.), Bolander's yampa (*Perideridia bolanderi* (Gray) Nels. and Macbr.), barestem desert parsley (*Lomatium nudicaule* (Pursh) Coult. and Rose), and the hairy-bracted variety of Eatons daisy (*Erigeron eatonii* Gray var. *villosus* Cronq.). Except for the subalpine components (subalpine fir, mountain bog gentian, etc.), the plant community is almost as if lifted piecemeal from the basalts of Midvale Summit along U.S. Highway 95 about 55 mi to the south-southeast. Thus, remaining atop most of the central Seven Devils are the uplifted and metamorphosed, "undifferentiated" (meaning little known) rocks called the Seven Devils Group (Gaston and Bennett 1979). Even casual observation shows that there is considerable variation in these rocks, but they remain unclassified.

Glacial moraines lie both east and west of the central Seven Devils, mostly below 6,500 ft elevation. On the east an extensive moraine perhaps 5 mi² or more in area extends for more than 5 mi between the Old Boise Trail 101 and the West Fork of the Rapid River, from about Horse Heaven Creek on the southwest to Bridge Creek on the northeast. On the west, another much smaller, perhaps half-square-mile moraine lies in Little Granite Creek below Baldy Lake and trail 124, mostly between the main forks of the creek. Other breaks in the seeming monotony of the Seven Devils Group rocks are the granitelike, usually light-colored, igneous intrusives (granodiorites, quartz diorites and monzonites, diorites, and gabbros) found covering several square miles in upper Devils Farm Creek and extending northwestward across Little Granite Creek to the Three Creek Divide. Similar lightcolored intrusives are highly visible in another 5-mi² area-the White Monument area of the Southern Seven Devils-lying between the Sheep Rock road 106 on the west and reaching into the head of Deep Creek below High Dive on the Black Lake road 112 on the east (from 5,400 ft to 8,300 ft), as well as in a 2-mi² area surrounding Echols Mountain (6,800 ft to 8,300 ft). There are no obvious vegetational changes associated with either the moraines or the granitelike intrusives.

There is no true alpine timberline even on the highest of the Seven Devils Mountains (He Devil, to 9,400 ft; She Devil, 9,300 ft). Weatherbeaten and runty whitebark pines (*Pinus albicaulis* Engelm.) and subalpine firs (*Abies lasiocarpa* [Hook.] Nutt.) grow in the rock crevices atop these highest peaks. And because of the steep upper slope gradients characterizing the severe erosional stress of the central Seven Devils, there appear to be none of the perched and poorly drained small plateaus that might support the tundralike vegetation often found elsewhere at these elevations.

BOTANICAL HISTORY OF THE SEVEN DEVILS MOUNTAINS

Over the past 88 years, more than 40 plant collectors or two-person collection parties have collected in the Seven Devils Mountains and have deposited plants in many herbaria across the United States. The pioneer collectors seem to have been the two self-taught, but skilled and recognized botanists, William C. Cusick and Marcus E. Jones. Both of them collected in the southern Seven Devils in 1899.

Cusick, who made most of his living from a farm near Union, OR, collected plants over much of eastern Oregon, particularly in the Wallowa Mountains. In July and again in September of 1899, however, he crossed the Snake River into Idaho (almost certainly at Ballard's Ferry 3 mi below Homestead) and collected plants along the then 10-year-old Kleinschmidt Grade, from the Snake River via Cuprum to Old Helena and the nearby Peacock mines. That grade, viewed today as frighteningly steep, had been completed in 1891 by mining entrepreneur Albert Kleinschmidt. But as late as 1920 it was described by visiting geologists as "well located...by far the best graded road the writers have seen in the state" (Carrey and others 1979). Among the more interesting plants Cusick collected on these two trips were the type collections of the Idaho variety of the white-stemmed frasera (*Frasera albicaulis* Dougl. var. *idahoensis* [St. John] Hitchc.), of which an isotype is held at WS, as well as the scarce tall phacelia (*Phacelia procera* Gray). The frasera now is recommended for a "Federal Watch List" by the Idaho Rare and Endangered Plants Technical Committee (Steele and others 1981, rev. 1983).

Marcus E. Jones was a mining engineer-botanist. From July through December of 1899 he collected plants, while secretly he prospected for coal deposits for the then new Pacific and Idaho Northern Railroad (now the Union Pacific line from Weiser to Tamarack) (Lenz 1983a). In that year, the new railroad was starting a line from Weiser, supposedly to the Helena (Peacock) mines (Carrey and others 1979). Work on the Helena end of that grade had begun in 1900 (Carrey and others 1979), and before the railroad diverted its line to New Meadows, and as pointed out by the Payette National Forest sign along road 106 south of Kinney Point, over a million dollars was wasted on the Helena-end grade. To the author's knowledge, Jones collected only one plant in the Seven Devils: No. 26583, collected at 6,000 ft elevation August 5, 1899, and much later designated by C. P. Smith as the type of a supposedly new lupine, named after the Seven Devils as *Lupinus diaboli-septem* (Smith 1951). Jones' journal, transcribed by Rancho Santa Ana Botanic Garden Director Lenz, indicates that he was constantly collecting plants in the summer and fall of 1899; also that he often was in the Cuprum area. But, because Jones kept no field collection notes until later in his life (Lenz 1983a) and because his journal is blank for the period July 19 to September 19, 1899, we do not know where in the Seven Devils he might have been on August 5, 1899, let alone what else he might have collected there. Jones' journal does reveal that while visiting mining claims near Baker, OR, he made a circuitous and probably difficult, 3-day side trip (March 6-8, 1900) to visit William Cusick. Jones decribes Cusick as "a farmer, poor, a Christian man, widower, 58 years old, and a very fine man." He and Cusick spent more than a day going over the latter's plants (Jones' journal as transcribed and provided by Lenz).

The next known collector of Seven Devils plants, in 1907, was John M. Aldrich, a Professor of Biology (1903-1913) and founder of the Department of Entomology at the University of Idaho. He was a close friend of the first University of Idaho botanist and plant collector Louis F. Henderson. Henderson (undated) reported having eight 45-minute classes every school day shortly after he reported to the new university in 1893, and that his colleague Aldrich carried a similar load. Henderson attributes to Aldrich, in answer to an inquiry as to which chair he occupied at the university, the remark, "We didn't any of us occupy 'chairs'—we all occupied settees!" Henderson (undated) also describes the burning of the University's main building in March 1906 as "when a disastrous fire swept off our large University building, and with it went all my equipment and my herbarium which had taken 25 years to make and was one of the joys of my life." Of course, Aldrich's 1907 collections escaped the fire and now are among the oldest at Idaho with accession numbers as low as 2264. Only 14 of Aldrich's Seven Devils collections have been found so far, all from the Camp Howard area in the extreme northern Seven Devils. Even so, they attest to Aldrich's diligence, since 12 of the 14 were made on the 4th of July.

There then occurred a 20-year hiatus in Seven Devils Mountains plant collecting. Serious plant collection began in the area in 1927. It was then that Harold St. John, a young Harvard Ph.D. and professor, and Lowell A. Mullen, student in the Washington State (then) College Department of Botany, mounted an 11-day plant collecting foray into the Seven Devils. They hired a packer-guide and rented saddle and pack stock, probably at the Reeves Ranch 2 mi southwest of Riggins at the mouth of Papoose Creek. Starting from there (2,400 ft elevation) in the early morning of July 17, 1927, they first ascended Squaw Creek about 3 mi on trail 110, then branched off to the right on the Indian Springs trail 46 and ascended past Lime Saddle about 3 more miles to the Old Boise Trail 101 on the Snake-Salmon Rivers divide about one-third mile south of Fire Camp Saddle. Then they proceeded southward 2 mi up the divide until they rejoined trail 110 just south of the treacherous stretch of trail 101 called The Narrows (7,600 ft). Here they turned westward again and proceeded down past the Old Timer Mine and the Forks of Sheep Creek (4,000 ft) and up the Sawyer-Bear Trap Creeks ridge to the Sheep-Bernard Creeks divide (7 mi, to 6,000 ft). Finally they descended, still westward, down the quarter-mile of trail 110 remaining for them to reach their first night's goal at the McGaffee Cow Camp (5,700 ft). Earl Hibbs, the youngest son (now in his mid-seventies) of the Martin Hibbs family (Granite Creek and Hibbs Cow Camp cattlemen) assures me that the old-timers often made round trips like that in those days (Hibbs 1984), but it would be a safe bet that the greenhorn botanists were tired and saddle-sore that night. They had collected only 15 plants during the long but busy day, but they had ridden about 15 rough, horizontal miles and 1% vertical miles.

On July 18 and 19, the two botanists, belying any exhaustion, logged another 1⁴/₃ miles vertically, westward down trail 110 to the Snake River at the mouth of Bernard Creek (1,400 ft) and back up to the Cow Camp, meanwhile collecting another 40 plants. Then on July 20 they headed south toward the high country, ascending the Dry Diggins Ridge trail 140 into the central Seven Devils. Considering that they had only the old-fashioned vasculums (loose-lidded, cylindrical, sheetmetal cans) for holding plants while preventing their withering prior to pressing, it is remarkable that they were able to collect and press more than 60 different collections that day. Some of the plants must have been pressed en route. On July 20 and 21, working on what they called the "Dry Diggins Area" (see discussion under "Checklist Format") at elevations they gave as 7,500 ft to 8,000 ft, they collected and pressed another 35 plants.

The high point of St. John's and Mullen's trip, literally and figuratively, came on July 24, when they climbed He Devil Mountain. Starting point, route, and mode of travel are uncertain, but either going or returning to the vicinity of Lily Pad Lake they apparently

descended into the head of the Echo Lake Fork of Little Granite Creek. About 50 collections were made while approaching or on He Devil Mountain. The taxa they collected as well as the elevations (for instance, 8542, Eriogonum ovalifolium Nutt. var. depressum Blank., summit of He Devil, 9,200 ft) certainly attest to their reaching the summit-and long before the Mazama Club established a climber's register there. Among the more interesting collections made on or near He Devil Mountain was the initial collection of what may prove to be a new variety of maidenhair fern (Adiantum pedatum L.; see body of checklist for more details on this taxon). Other uncommon plants collected that day were the alpine lily (Lloydia serotina [L.] Sweet), and dwarf hulsea (Hulsea nana Gray). On July 25 and 26, they broke camp near Lily Pad Lake and returned to the Reeves Ranch via McGaffee Cow Camp and Sheep Creek, making more than 35 collections en route. They must have made a side trip well down Sheep Creek, for a timothy (*Phleum pratense* L.) collection of July 26 is labeled "garden clearing by cabin in Sheep Creek, 2,000 ft." Altogether, they made over 240 collections on the 11-day trip, 176 of them from above 5,000-ft elevation. Almost all of these collections remain in WS. The above four paragraphs are based on photocopies of St. John's field collection notes and his letter of October 18, 1982 (St. John 1982).

Although St. John remained at Washington State College only through 1929, his "Flora of Southeastern Washington and of Adjacent Idaho" (St. John 1937) was not published until 8 years later. This flora includes treatment of St. John's Seven Devils collections. St. John must have imparted a real appreciation of Hells Canyon and the Seven Devils Mountains to his students and instructors at Washington State College. He states (St. John 1982) that he made "eight or nine trips by boat from Lewiston up into Hells Canyon and made numerous collections." These annual field trips led by St. John, Hannah Aase, Lincoln Constance, Reed Rollins, Frederick Meyer, and probably other professors and instructors of botany were staged by the Natural History Club and continued for more than 15 years, up to World War II. This checklist includes collections made off the river, but from above 5,000 ft, by seven different Washington State College graduate or undergraduate students from 1936 to 1939 (see Comstock, Meyer, Moore, Munro, Packard, Peters, and Sharsmith, table 1). Lincoln Constance and Reed C. Rollins, then professors at Washington State College, also collected extensively in Hells Canyon in 1936 and named the uncommon or rare Snake River Canyon endemics Arabis crucisetosa and Mirabilis macfarlanei. Constance, in the spring of 1937, attempting to reach the higher elevations along road 517, drove up Squaw Creek and lower Papoose Creek on May 29. He made at least five collections (1,848-52) between 2,500 ft and 4,000 ft elevation, but was stopped above that by snow.

Next among the early Seven Devils plant collectors was Vernon M. Brewer, who was the Ranger at the Weiser (now Payette) National Forest's Bear Ranger Station (now Guard Station) 25 mi northwest of Council, ID. The district had a large acreage of summer rangeland, and, undoubtedly, range management problems made heavy demands on Ranger Brewer's time. In any event, he became a plant collector, sending a few of his plants to the College of Forestry at Moscow for identification or verification. His known collections made between 1928 and 1931 have numbers between 5 and 147, and 95 of them have been found (73 by supervisory forestry technician James N. Camp in the Council R.D. herbarium, and 22 by the author in IDF and Council R.D. herbaria). Later, while ranger at the old Hornet Station 12 mi northwest of Council, Brewer became so embroiled in controversy with grazing permitees that he was transferred to Wyoming (Pierson 1983).

Jacqueline Packard, another member of the Washington State College Botany Department, was also an early and important plant collector in the Seven Devils Mountains. Packard became friends with Esther and Earl Hibbs as an undergraduate at WSC and on collecting trips into Hells Canyon. In 1938 she embarked on a Master of Science program, with the thesis to be a flora of the Seven Devils Mountains (see copy of herbarium label, fig. 1b). This thesis, however, was destined never to be finished, for at the University and on Hells Canyon field trips she met forestry student William R. Moore (table 1). With the Natural History Club, they collected plants together near McGaffee Cow Camp in May 1936, and (the whole Club staying at the Hibbs Ranch) in lower Granite Creek and along the Snake River as far up as Brush Creek in April 1938. In 1940 Packard married Moore, a graduate forester, and moved with him to a job with the Border Patrol in Texas. She was thus forced to abandon her Master of Science degree. Beginning as an undergraduate in 1936, and continuing as a graduate student in 1938 and 1939, Packard had made over 400 collections in the Snake River Canyon and in the Seven Devils. More than 120 of these were from above 5,000 ft elevation in the Seven Devils and were made mostly in 1937 and 1938 while staying with the Hibbs. Almost all of these collections remain in WS.

Packard sent the author a typed account of her June 13-30, 1937, collection trip, when she lived with the Hibbs at the Granite Creek ranch and their Cow Camp in the head of the north fork of Little Granite Creek. This "journal" contains many interesting anecdotes, only one of which will be repeated here. Packard had written friend Esther Hibbs, then at the Granite Creek ranch, that she (Packard) would arrive on a certain day at Johnson Bar on the Snake River via the riverboat "Chief Joseph." But on arrival no one met her with the expected saddle horse. Somehow she tied her heavy and bulky plant press on her packsack and began the 10-mi hike upriver to Granite Creek. She saw no one until she accidently met Earl Hibbs on horseback near the mouth of Granite Creek, only a half-mile short of her destination. Earl now suggests that she may have arrived on the same boat as her letter.

As indicated by the herbarium label illustrated in figure 1, Packard was the second person to collect the rare maidenhair fern of the Seven Devils. Her collection likely is from the identical locality as St. John and Mullen's 1927 collection, and Wellner's or Bingham and Miller's later collections, west of Sheep Lake.

The Moores, now retired and living in Novato, CA, mailed the author a large packet of materials, including Packard's thesis outline and map, photos, some of their original field collection notebooks, rough herbarium labels covering collections other than 1937-38, plus many notes on the collections of others (Comstock, Constance, Hibbs, Meyer, Munro, Peters, Sharsmith, and St. John; table 1). With the Moores' permission, eventually these will be deposited with the Marion Ownbey Herbarium or the Washington State University Library archives.

Eminent among plant collectors of the 1930's to 1950's, and in order of number of plants collected in the Seven Devils, were (1) John H. Christ, USDA Soil Conservation Service, Portland, OR; (2) William H. Baker, Department of Biological Sciences and former Director of the University of Idaho Herbarium, Moscow, ID; and (3) Ray J. Davis, founder and first director of the Idaho State University (now Ray J. Davis) Herbarium, Pocatello, ID. Christ, who spent a lifetime collecting mostly Idaho plants, often as a backpacker in the most remote areas, indeed was indefatigable—his collections totaled over 19,000 (collection ledgers, beautifully handwritten and updated after verification of plant identities, are at ID). His industry as a collector is exemplified by the fact that in a single day, covering several miles of extremely rough and broken terrain near Black Lake in the southern Seven Devils, he gathered and pressed 128 separate collections. Late in his life, Christ sold his personal and main herbarium to the New York Botanical Garden (NY), although about a quarter of his collections can be found in ID and WS.

Baker was the only early collector known to have covered the White Bird Ridge portion of the Seven Devils, between the Little Salmon and Rapid Rivers. His rough accession notebooks, covering over 19,170 collections, are at ID, and almost all of his Seven Devils collections remain there. Davis, author of the "Flora of Idaho" (1952), apparently made only one whirlwind collection trip into the Seven Devils, from June 24 to July 3, 1940. On the June 26-28 part of this trip, he probably joined Marion Ownbey, Hannah Aase, and Frederick Meyer of the Washington State College Botany Department (then with students on a spring field trip), and collected with them at Heavens Gate, along trail 112, at Dry Diggins Lookout and at Bernard Lakes. It is very uncertain from Davis' collection numbering, but he could have made as many as 100 to 150 collections in the Seven Devils. Only about 45 of these have been found in ID and WS, however. Most of the remainder can only become known through a herbarium search at IDS because Davis' field collection notebooks were discarded when his Pocatello home was closed by his children in 1982 (Davis 1983). Davis' northern Idaho collections were quite skimpy, and in "Flora of Idaho" he relied heavily on the collections of John H. Christ and C. Epling. Details of the range of Christ, Baker, and Davis collections will be found in table 1.

Five other well-known botanists, each of whom collected 30 to 65 plants while spending 1 to 6 days in the Seven Devils, include:

1. Aven Nelson, whose field records and almost all of his 65 Seven Devils collections are at RM (B. E. Nelson 1983).

2. Quentin Jones, in 1950 working toward a masters degree at the Washington State College Department of Botany.

3. Arthur R. Kruckeberg, Department of Botany, University of Washington, who visited the Seven Devils twice, the second time (1952) leading a field trip of University of Washington students.

4. Marion Ownbey, later director of the WSC (now Ownbey) Herbarium, with Frederick Meyer and Hannah Aase, leading a 1940 WSC botany field trip.

5. Francis W. Pennell, monographer of the Scrophulariaceae, whose 1937 Black Lake area foray was chronicled by his field notes deposited at and obtained from the Philadelphia Academy of Natural Sciences (PH). Most of his Seven Devils collections remain there (Spawn 1983; Schuyler 1984). See table 1 for details on the Seven Devils collections of these five collectors.

Among the 31 remaining Seven Devils plant collectors, and aside from Bingham and Miller, only 10 have gathered from 10 to 29 collections. These collectors are Verne E. Comstock, a WSC agronomy student; Douglass M. Henderson, director, ID; Frederick J. Hermann of the Forest Service, whose personal herbarium recently was deposited at the University of Michigan Herbarium; Monta C. LaZelle, an herbarium assistant at ID, who started a Seven Devils flora; Frederick G. Meyer, then a WSC botany graduate student, who visited the Seven Devils in four different years with the natural history club and with Marion Ownbey; William R. Moore, a WSC forestry student, later husband of Jacqueline Packard, who also made many St. Joe National Forest plant collections while on summer work near Avery, ID; Gerald W. Munro, a WSC horticulture student; Don L. Peters, a WSC agriculture student; Edwin W. Tisdale, emeritus professor of range management at the College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences, University of Idaho, then establishing study plots for grassland habitat typing; and Charles A. Wellner, Forest Service, first chairman of the Idaho Natural Areas Council and largely responsible for establishment work on the proposed Little Granite Creek Research Natural Area, also the only person known to have collected atop Pollock Mountain. The details of the collections of these 10 collectors, along with those of the collections of the remaining 20 known Seven Devils collectors, will be found in table 1.

The Seven Devils Mountains of west-central Idaho rise to almost 9,400 ft elevation, but occupy a very narrow strip of mostly Hells Canyon Wilderness lands lying between the Snake and Salmon River drainages. Plant taxa are checklisted for these mountains. Collections representing 722 taxa are annotated as to collector's names and accession numbers, herbaria where deposited, and locality, elevation, and habitat of the collection site. Data came from 2,700 collections found in seven herbaria, or from field collection notes of 13 different plant collectors.
