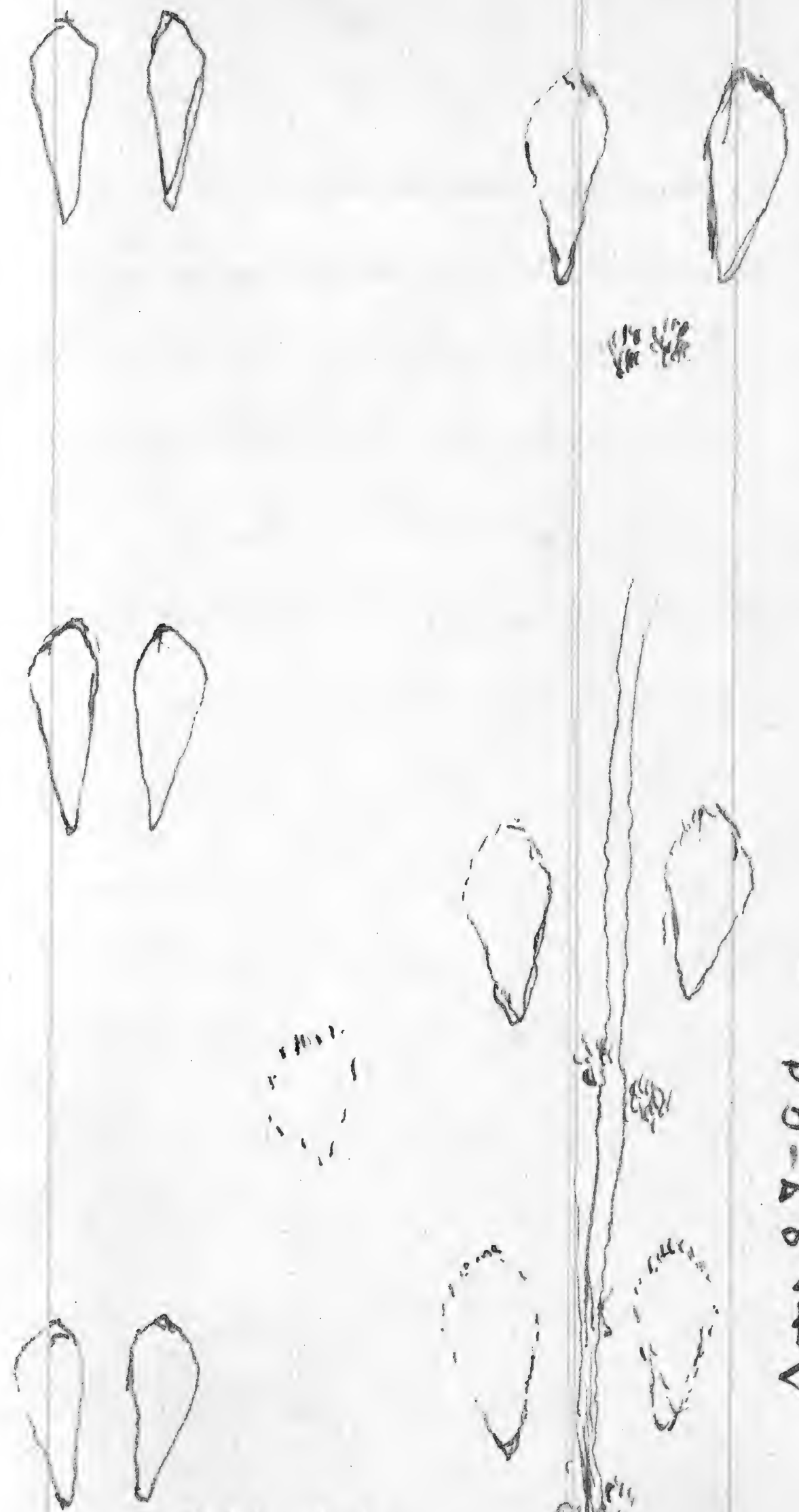
7. Two kinds of Perognathus

Repay his lonely toil.

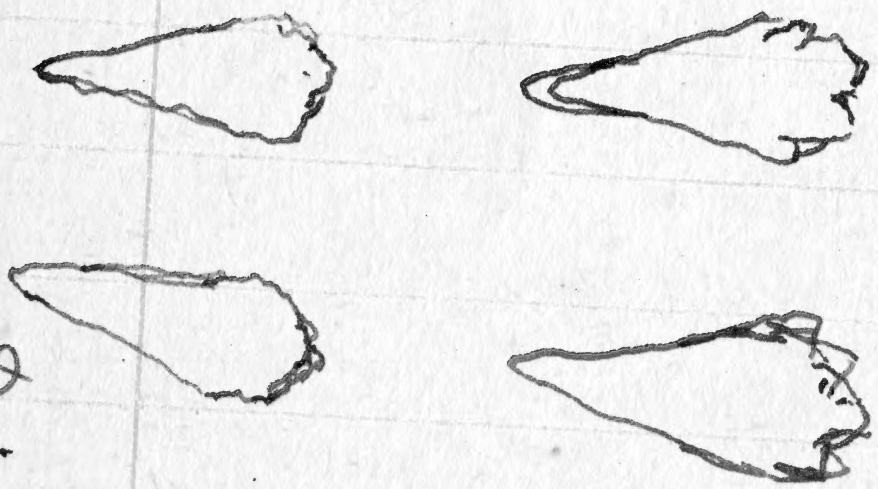
1. The sun had left the Mt. tops,

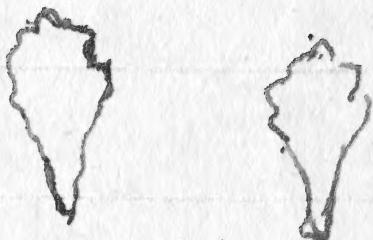
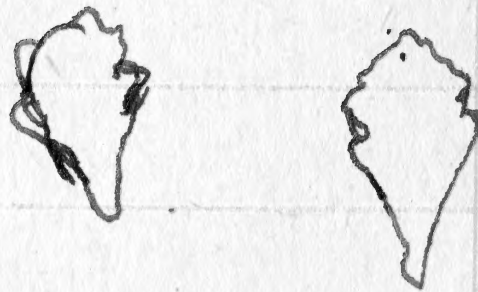

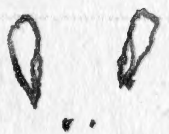


Australia, New, Nov. 15, 90.
