DAHLIAS are divided into Shows, Fancies, Pompons, Decorative and Cactus.

SHOW DAHLIAS include all large close flowering varieties of a single color and those in which the ground color is of a lighter shade than the edges.

FANCY DAHLIAS include all striped large flowering varieties and those in which the ground color is darker than the edges or tips.

POMPON DAHLIAS include all small flowering varieties.

DECORATIVE DAHLIAS include all large, loose flowering varieties.

CACTUS DAHLIAS are known by their long, pointed and twisted petals.

MY STOCK consists of pot roots and field grown roots, where I cannot send roots will supply in plants.

ALL BULBS sent out by me have from one to three eyes and are guaranteed true to name and to give satisfaction.

ORDER EARLY as stock is limited on some of the varieties.

WHERE STOCK IS EXHAUSTED I do not substitute, but return money, unless otherwise ordered.

FOR \$1.00 I will send 12 named varieties, my selection no two alike.

FOR \$2.00 I will send 25 named varieties, my selection no two alike.

In planting, stir the ground thoroughly, mixing the fertilizer well with the earth.

Plant about four inches deep three or more feet apart; allow but one stock to grow in a place.

NEW NOVELTIES FOR 1920

- CHARITY SLOCOMBE (Decorative).** This is unquestionably the finest white decorative Dahlia grown. Beautiful glistening pure white flowers freely produced and carried on long stiff stems measuring eight inches and more across, not at all coarse, the petals beautifully curled and twisted, giving the flower a very refined appearance. \$2.50.
- C. W. HAYDEN (Decorative).** A very large massive built flower, with very long stems, color purplish magenta. \$1.50.
- DUDLEY C. HATHAWAY, 2nd (Decorative).** A new Dahlia which I am listing for the first time. The bushes which are dwarf and very rugged are covered with a mass of flowers from six to eight inches in diameter, resembling a hugh bouquet. The color is a creamy yellow shading out to a white tip. Field grown tubers. \$5.00.

- COCKATOO.** An approved variety of the Cactus type with lemon-yellow colored petals, and the florets with pinkish-amber color. The florets are well formed. 25c.
- CONQUEST.** One of the largest and best of the Dark varieties; long stiff stems. 50c.
- CREPUSCULE.** Yellow shading to amber-yellow. The blooms are excellent for exhibition purposes. 25c.

DECORATIVE DAHLIAS

This impressed us so much that we decided to grow all the introductions, and to select therefrom those which pleased us in regard to habit of growth—particularly the way in which the flowers were produced upon the plants—floriferousness and general effectiveness in the garden. In size they cannot be equaled and for decorative purpose they are unexcelled.

This collection includes all the Giant Decorative Dahlias. Some of them attaining the grand dimensions of 8 or 9 inches in diameter. The flowers growing as they do upon long stems are splendid for Decorative purposes and for exhibition, win Prizes wherever shown.

A. E. JOHNSON. The ground is white, or light blush, overlaid with a clear rose-pink, very large and fine. 35c.

ALBERT MANDA. This is one of our largest varieties. The ground color is white with shadings of lemon and pink, varying according to season, situation and exposure. Should be grown by every exhibitor. 50c.

BEACHEY. An enormous flower of a crimson-maroon color. The bushes are a mass of flowers from early in August until frost; it has a strong stem. \$1.50.

BEAUTE LYONNAISE. White edged red grand flower, perfect stems. 25c.

BELOIT. Particularly effective on account of its very large flowers, borne on stems 18 to 20 inches long and held well above the foliage; these are full double, of splendid form, of a rich purplish-garnet, shading deeper towards the center. 75c.

BERCH VAN HEEMSTEDÉ. A remarkably handsome variety, of perfect form, especially distinguished for its purity of color—a most exquisite pure yellow. This variety is one of the latest importations from Holland, being introduced there in 1914, where it was awarded the First-class Certificate. 50c.

BLANCHE CHARMET. A beautiful white, decorative, fine form, long stems. If you are looking for something extra good, this is the one you want. \$1.00.

COMMANDANT RIVOIRE. Immense flower with spoon shape petals, carmine red, purpled with reflex of a violet color on the ends. Petals often and largely pointed white, producing a superb effect. 75c.

DELICE. Bright pink suffused with a lavender pink, flowers perfect. 40c.

EPOCHE. A hybrid, petals long and slightly twisted at the ends, color, royal purple. 75c.

- ERNEST ELLSWORTH.** (Seedling). Introduction of 1915. First class certificate New Bedford Horticultural society, 1914. A large ruby red flower on long, stiff stems, with quilled petals. Should be in every collection. 75c.
- FIREBURST.** Bright scarlet of the largest size. 50c.
- LU G. SCHEIF.** Color, a bright light chamois, with just a faint suggestion of orange. Petals, by their peculiar twisting, show the coppery orange of the reverse. 75c.
- GABRIEL DELAON.** Color, a velvety blackish maroon. Extra large. 25c.
- GIANT PURPLE.** Large, very rich purple. Flowers are borne on enormous long stems of wiry stiffness, and are produced in great abundance. 50c.
- GIGANTEA.** Gigantic and massive in form. The individual petals are short and it requires many to form such a monstrous flower. Color, a soft sulphur-yellow, distinct and attractive. 25c.
- GRAND DUKE ALEXIS.** Large massive flowers, quilled petals, color ivory-white tinged lavender. 25c.
- HATTIE HOLCOMBE.** A very free flowering variety, flowers are borne on good stems, well above the foliage, color clear yellow, lighter at tips. 50c.
- HENRY MAIER.** Called the yellow Mina Burgle, has many of the good characteristics of that variety. Color is a deep yellow, sometimes faintly edged bronze. 50c.
- IMPERATOR.** It develops, according as the size of the root is, from 6 to 10 strong shoots; these branch but little and attain a height of from 4 to 5 feet. The flowers are very large indeed, from 6½ to 7½ inches in diameter; the blooms face upward and are borne on stems as thick as a finger. The color is of a very soft ivory-white, the upper edges of the petals being suffused with lilac rose. 75c.
- J. M. GOODRICH.** A salmon pink flower of great beauty; large size, on long stiff stems, fine for cutting. 50c.
- JOHN R. BALDWIN.** A remarkably handsome variety that will not suffer by comparison with many of the finest imported varieties. The flowers are uniformly large, very compact and with full high center. The color is a yellow-buff, with the outer half of each petal delicately suffused with red in a manner impossible to describe with justice to the flower. 25c.
- KAKADEE.** Exquisite lemon-yellow, passing to white at tips, making it exceedingly attractive and novel. Finest dwarf, bushy habit. The large blooms are quite double but change to true peony form late in the fall. 75c.

MANITOU. Immense size, full center, often 8 inches in diameter. The color is pleasing, being an amber bronze with a distinct shading of pink. Not suitable for cutting, as the flower is too large and the stems short. 50c.

MARJORIE FIELD. This is one of the best of this type which has been introduced for years. Flowers grow as large as 7 inches in diameter with stems 2 feet long, color a wonderful shade of pink. \$1.00.

MARTHA. A very large flower of a vivid crimson color; the stems are long and very rigid. A fine exhibition flower. \$1.00.

MARY GARDEN. A large remarkably well formed flower, strong grower, with an abundance of flowers on long, stiff stems. Color a pure lemon yellow. 35c.

MEADOW GOLD. An extra large well shaped flower borne on long stiff stems. Color primrose yellow with faint markings of pink toward the outer petals. 50c.

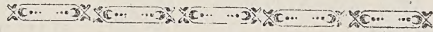
