Mary Rowlandson was a colonial American woman who was captured by Native Americans in 1675 during King Philip's War and endured eleven weeks of captivity before being ransomed. After her release, she wrote a book about her experience, The Sovereignty and Goodness of God: Being a Narrative of the Captivity and Restoration of Mrs. Mary Rowlandson, which is considered a seminal work in the American literary genre of captivity narratives. Rowlandson's book became one of the era's bestsellers, going through four editions in one year. (Wikipedia)
