
ARISTOTLE



PRIOR ANALYTICS IS THE THIRD OF ARISTOTLE'S SIX TEXTS ON LOGIC WHICH ARE COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS THE ORGANON ("INSTRUMENT"). IN PRIOR ANALYTICS ARISTOTLE CONDUCTS A FORMAL STUDY OF ARGUMENTS. IN LOGIC AN ARGUMENT IS A SERIES OF TRUE OR FALSE STATEMENTS WHICH LEAD TO A TRUE OR FALSE CONCLUSION. ARISTOTLE IDENTIFIES VALID AND INVALID FORMS OF ARGUMENTS CALLED SYLLOGISMS. A SYLLOGISM IS AN ARGUMENT CONSISTING OF THREE SENTENCES: TWO PREMISES AND A CONCLUSION. OF THE ENTIRE ARISTOTLIAN CORPUS ARISTOTLE GIVES PRIORITY TO THE STUDY OF HIS TREATISES ON LOGIC.
