

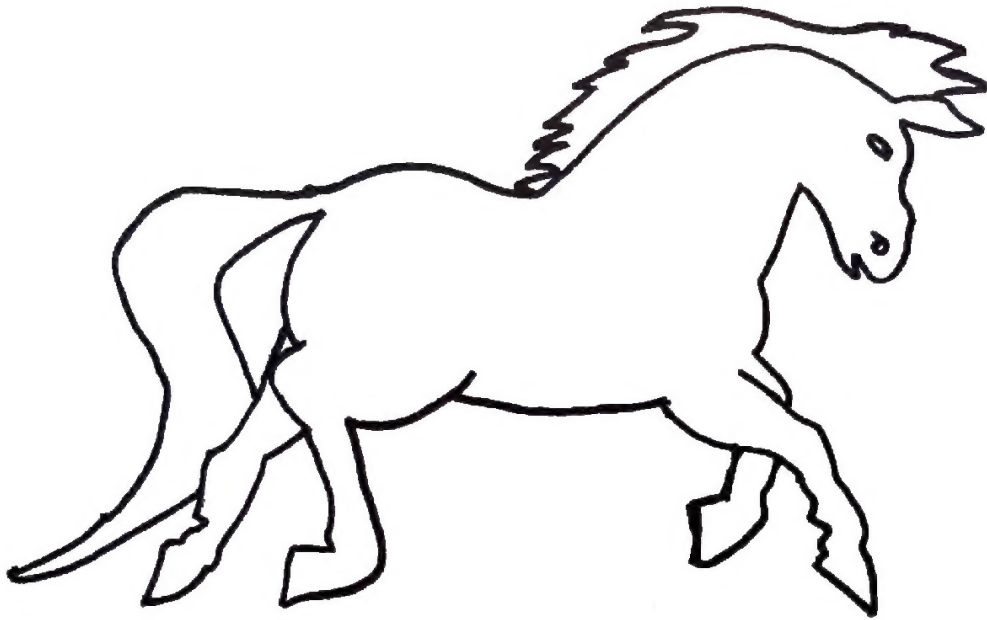

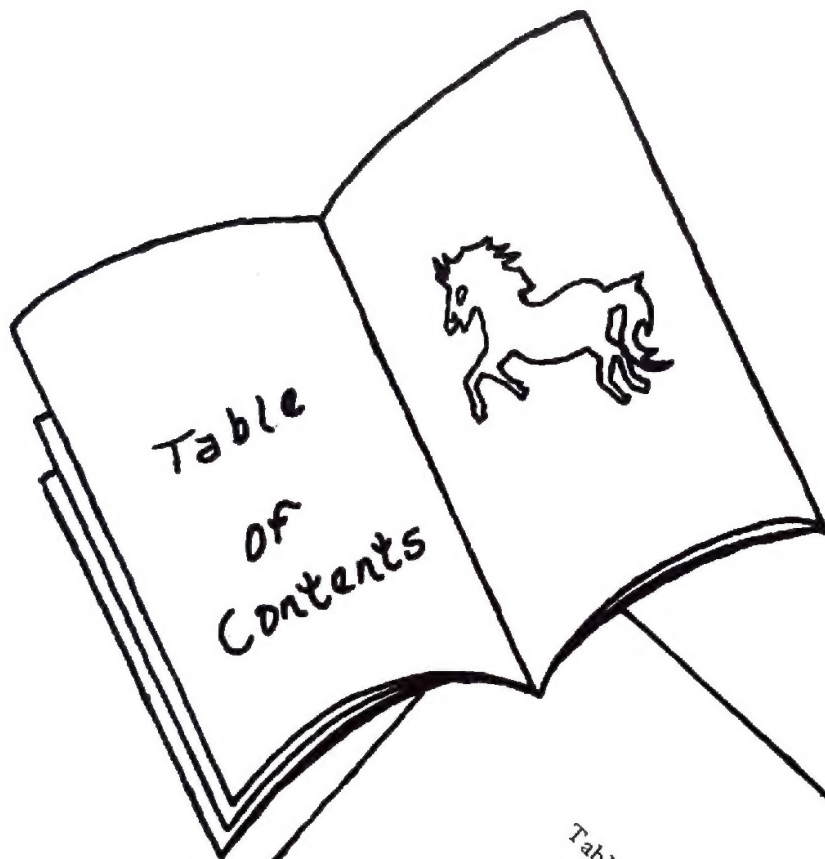

In future years when we review our high school days there will be one person whom we shall long remember. Her devoted counseling and teaching have impressed on us the value of an education and good citizenship in today's world.

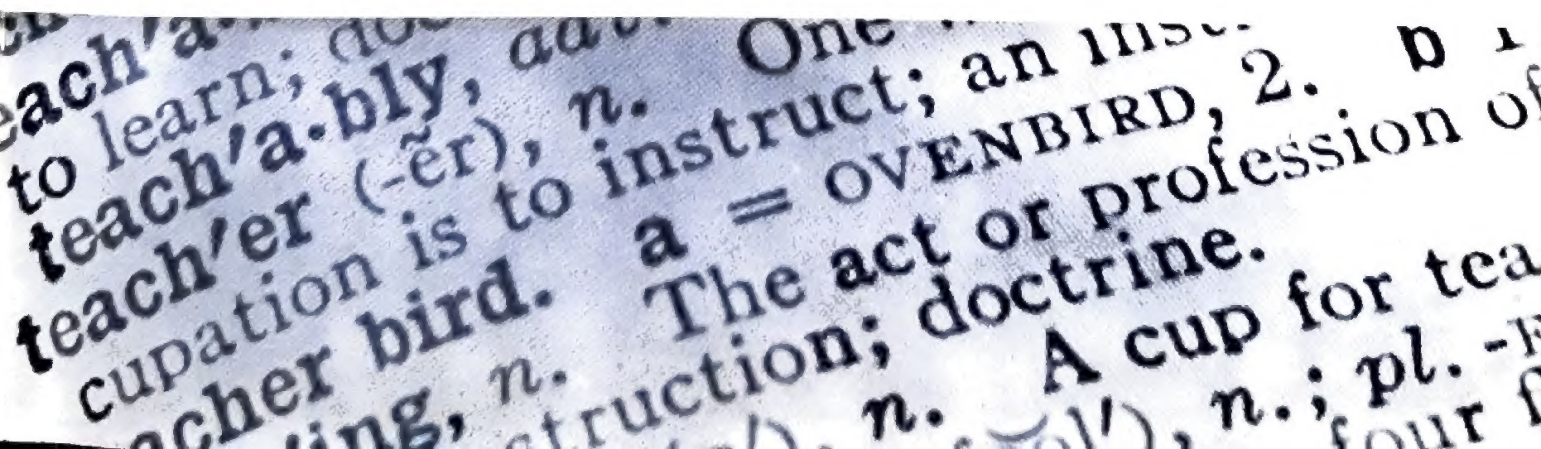
She has inspired enthusiasm in her students and admiration among her fellow faculty members. Those who have known her will not soon forget the lessons she taught nor the deeds she exemplified.

More respect and a deeper prospect.

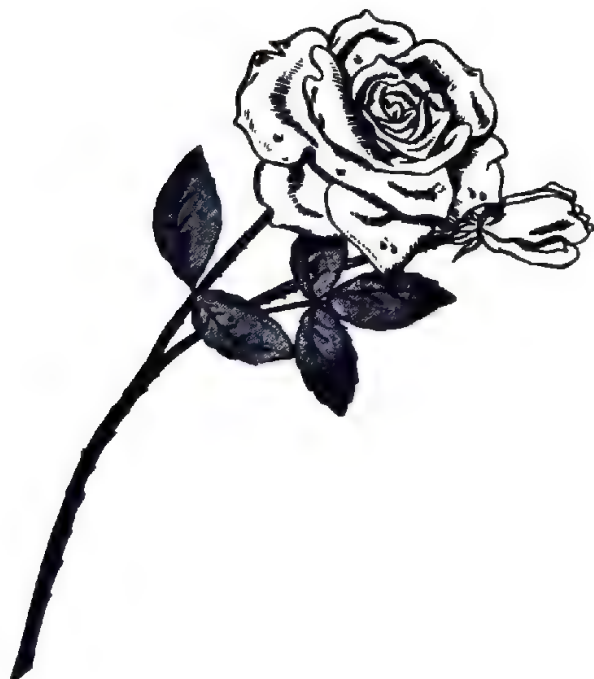
