THE MARTIN FAMILY.

Richard Martin, the father of Samuel, who was the first of the Martin family to come to America, was a prominent manufacturer in Belfast. He was a member of the Irish House of Parliament. During the period of his serving in Parliament he received the nick name of "Mad Dick," which clung to him ever afterward. He was our great-great-grandfather.

His son, Samuel, our great grandfather, was born at Bolton-le-Moor, Lancashire, England, on May 2, 1760. While on a visit to Ireland he met Miss Jane Trotter, the daughter of a landed proprietor of Belfast, whom he married. The Trotters were an old English family who had come to Ireland at the time of the fall of Charles I. in England and the rise of the Cromwell. Miss Jane Trotter was born July 10, 1767. One of Samuel's sons, named after himself, was an officer in the British Dragoons. Samuel came to America in 1828. He died a year later.

Thomas, the son of Samuel, was born at Bolton-le-Moor, on January 8, 1808. He came to America with his father and married Miss Agnes Thornley. He died June 10, 1877, in Philadelphia, where father also died. He was buried at Frankfort, Philadelphia, Pa. A list of his children is given on opposite page. Two of his sons were medical doctors and three of them served in the Civil War as officers in the Union Army.
