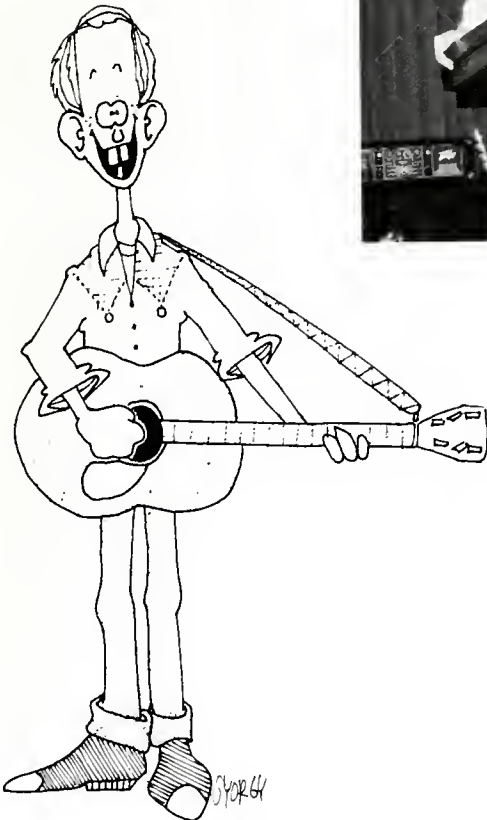




Chapel

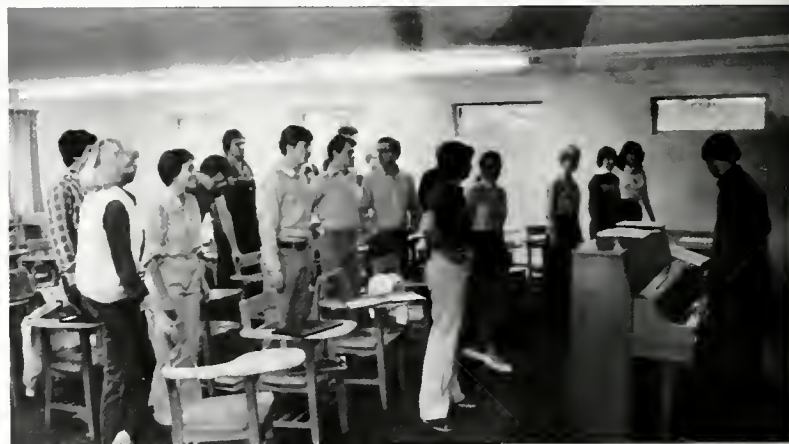
Hand Bell Choir
