"Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way . . . and imitate their way." Heb. 13:7-8



























E is for enjoyment. God wants us to be happy, to enjoy life and to enjoy him.



Dr. Silas M. Vaughn (left) is the president of Montreat-Anderson College. His main duties are those of implementing the policies adopted by the Board of Trustees, and of administering the affairs of the college. Half of his time is spent in Montreat, while the other half is spent off-campus raising funds for the college.

Choir






The M-AC choir, under the able direction of Mr. Ed Carwithen, was found singing all styles of music throughout the school year.

Handbells




The Handbell Choir was a small group of six people who met every Wednesday morning after chapel. The music they mastered was an inspiration to everyone who heard it.

Christmas was a busy time for the ringers as they played in chapel and for churches around the area.




me. Also, your artwork is incredible. Absoultely incredible.
