CLASS HISTORY

1962

quer who believe they can"; our mascots, Dawn Scott and Scott Dayvault; our flower, the bronze orchid; and the class colors, brown and gold.

Our Little Wonders football team carried our prestige in its capable hands. Representing us on the first-string team were: Jim Gantt, Grey Clarke, Jimmy Roseman, Jimmy Hodgens, Johnny Gullede, Jimmy Carter, Dean Canup, Ricky Caldwell, Kenneth Moore and Wayne Wilson. The senior class sold hot dogs at each home game. The experiences and ties began to draw closer with each succeeding day. The basketball, wrestling, baseball, and track teams each gave us thrilling and proud moments. They carried our honor on their shoulders and raised it to even greater heights.

Tapped into the National Honor Society were Alice Cannon, Beverly Moore, Sarah Clayton, Willie Mae Adams, Sandy Wood, Pam Fletcher, Tommy Childress, Juanene Phelps, and Cecil Lambert. We had almost reached our promised land: the future. Senior Day, the long-awaited day, came also. Laughter filled the air, but sorrow was hidden in our hearts, for this was our last journey into a dream world together. Rehearsals began immediately for graduation; each walk down the aisle brought reality closer and our long-awaited goal nearer. Miss Loraine Gray, our advisor, guided us through these events. Soon we solemnly marched down the aisle to the strains of "Pomp and Circumstance," we hesitantly walked across the stage and took into our hands one of the keys to our success. We returned with a new assurance that "they conquer who believe they can."

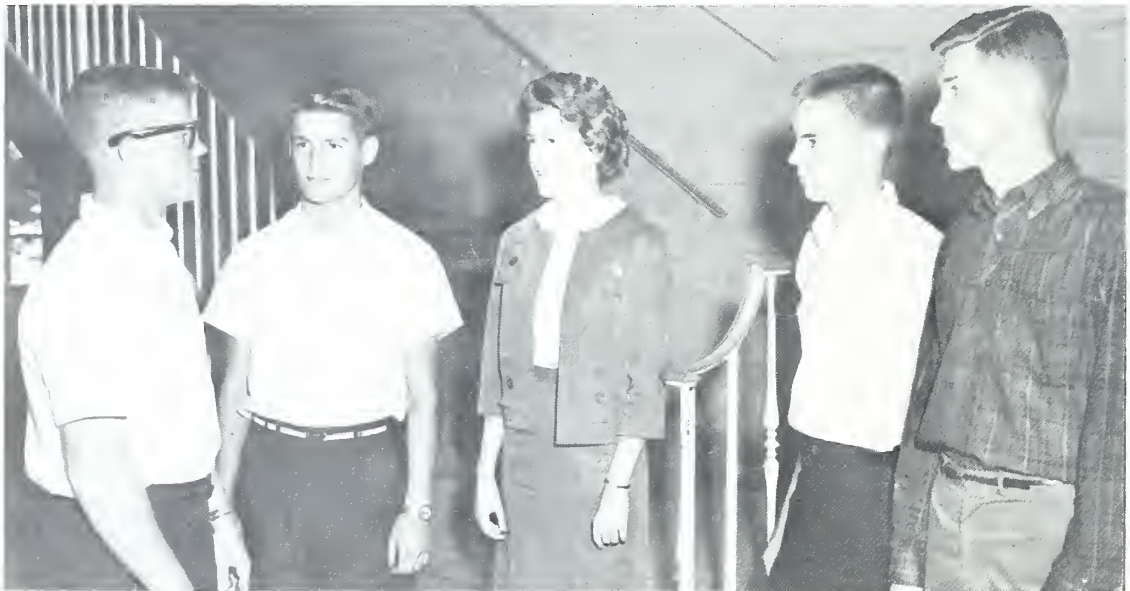
The Jr.-Sr. could not be forgotten with its excitement nor could the Washington trip which made it fun to learn about our country and be
