CLASS HISTORY

One's life is like unto a jewel—when first created it is quite dull; but each life, as each jewel, has the power to reflect light. To produce the greatest possible brilliance, facets must be cut and polished. Like unhewn gems we began our years together at Brown. Trials and errors, successes and failures, tears and triumphs, study and fellowship have polished and refined one facet of the gem which is our life. Our years at Brown High constitute one of those facets, one of the many which we shall never forget or let go undusted in the future. We recall the shadowy uncertainty which marked us as sophomores when we first became part of Brown in 1960. Under the supervision of Mr. Larry Rhye, our class advisor, we elected our leaders for the year: Beverly Harrington served as president; Kathy Love, vice-president; Yvonne Crumbley, secretary; and Marilyn Hill, treasurer. Becky McLeod and Eddy Trott represented our class as council members. Through the guidance of these leaders, we began to grow in wisdom and stature.

Many of our students were recognized for excellence in various fields. Yvonne Crumbley and Jane Smith were honored by being tapped into the National Honor Society. The Key Club inducted into its membership Eddy Trott and Ronald Williams. The Thespians selected Suzanne Wagner, and the Quill and Scroll honored Linda Barnes, Nancy Osborne, and Eddie Rumsey.

With the year drawing to a close, the student body elected Yvonne Crumbley and Eddy Trott to the offices of secretary and treasurer, respectively, of the Student Organization. Joyce Earley, Marty Harrison, and Jean Wood were chosen as cheerleaders. For their skill in journalism, Joyce Earley was selected as BROWN BEAT editor; and Eddie Rumsey, ALBROKAN editor.

Gaining luster from the experiences of the previous year, we entered the Junior class confident that some brilliance now sparkled from the facet. Chosen to guide us were Mickey Baucom, president; Richard Cline, vice-president; Brenda Dayvault, treasurer; Gary Norris, secretary; and Eddie Rumsey, social chairman. Beverly Harrington and Mikey Cauble were council members.

As in our sophomore year, many students were honored for their achievements. The National Honor Society tapped into their organization: Shirley Daniel, Carolyn Mitchell, Eddie Rumsey, David Simerly, Eddy Trott, Ronald Williams, and Jean Wood. Accepted for membership into the Key Club were Mickey Baucom, Mikey Cauble, Denny Hill, and Eddie Rumsey. The Quill and Scroll selected Rebecca Barnard, David Simerly, Joyce Earley, and Myra Pressley. Inducted into the National Thespian Society were Linda Barnes, Doug Barger, Mikey Cauble, Mick Cobb, Ronnie Eller, Myra Pressley, Rosemary Sills, Julia Ritchie, Eddie Rumsey, Kenneth Sellers, David Simerly, and Alice Stroup.

Our advisor, Mrs. Carol Cooke, helped to guide us through the glittering array of junior events. We

recall with brilliant reflections the glorious Washington Trip 1962; the junior class play, LOOK HOMEWARD, ANGEL; the exotic Junior-Senior which became our "Oriental Paradise"; and the arrival of our cherished class rings.

Chosen to serve as cheerleaders for the coming year were Marty Harrison, chief, Anita Ashley, Joyce Earley, Becky McClamrock, Linda Pennell, and Jean Wood. Responsibilities were exchanged as Joyce Earley became ALBROKAN editor; Eddie Rumsey, BROWN BEAT editor. Elected to serve the student body as president was Mikey Cauble, and Eddie Trott as vice-president.

The beauty of the gem was now evident; but as we began our senior year, we knew that much burnishing had yet to be done before the facet would be perfected.

During the first of many class meetings we chose as our leaders Terry Ridenhour, president; Richard Cline, vice-president; Becky McLeod, secretary; Brenda Dayvault, treasurer; and Shirley Daniel, chaplain. Beverly Harrington and Ronald Williams represented our class in Council. Reigning over the Homecoming festivities was Angelus Chambers, and representing us in the Carrousel Parade was Suzanne Wagner, Miss Brown High. Becky McLeod was elected by the class as its Miss Hi Miss. Honored to be May Queen was Jean Wood and Maid of Honor, Judy DeMarcus. Donna Phillips and Stewart Fisher were chosen as mascots, and the class selected "With the ropes of the past, we will ring the bells of the future" as its motto and the white carnation and blue and silver as its flower and colors.

Our class was ably represented in each of the five sports programs: football, basketball, wrestling, baseball, and track. Challenged by Miss Loraine Gray, our class advisor, during the football season, the seniors sold and sold and sold hot dogs at all of the home games.

In the early part of the year, the Key Club accepted Benny Hinson and Mike Moss for membership. Later the Quill and Scroll honored Jean Wood, Emma Sue Cheek, Susie Cowan, Shirley Daniel, and Jan Lynn Weaver.

Then came Senior Day! For the last time we shared our gaiety together as seniors. Class meetings, rehearsals, and final instructions filled our remaining days. Amid mixed emotions, we took the long walk across the stage to receive our long-awaited diplomas.

With painstaking precision we have worked for four years, giving shape and polish to this one facet of our life—a high school education. As our education and our experiences continue and other facets take shape, our lives will become indeed a gem of rarity, beauty, and durability.

Cast members enliven "The Farmer and the Cowman" which was only one of the songs with dance that appeared in the successful production of OKLAHOMA.

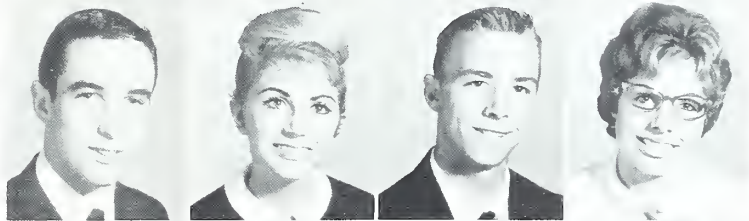

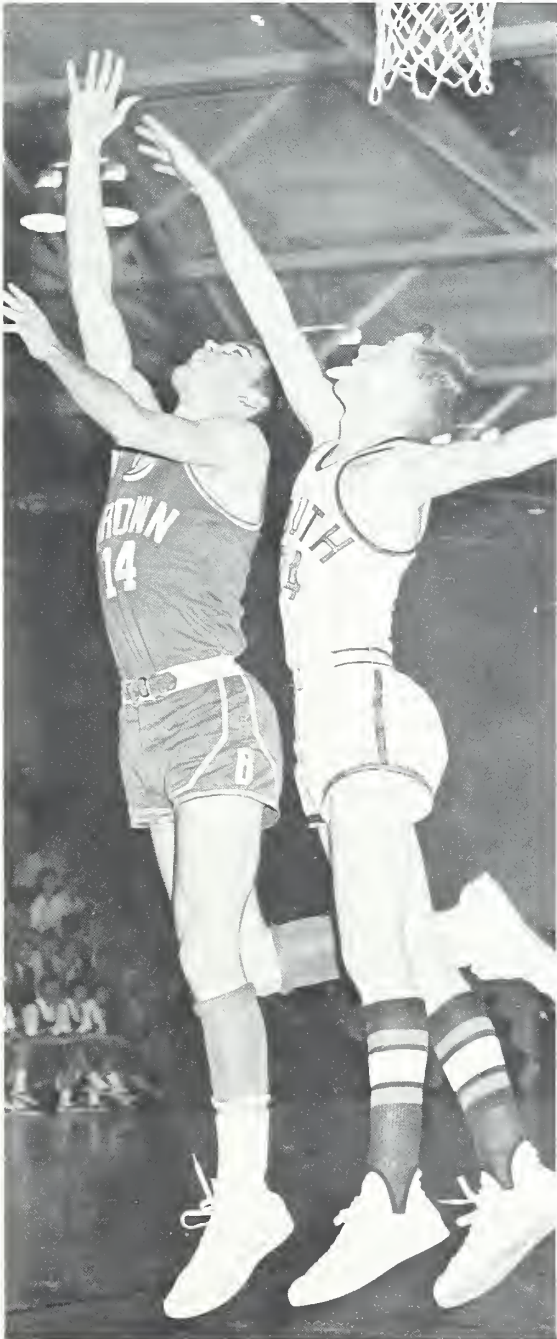
