CLASS HISTORY

A first look at Brown High School in 1961 gave a different impression from what we were accustomed to, and from what many of us probably expected. Though everything was new and different, the sophomore class soon became an important and active part of the school. New faces, new problems, and new opportunities, together with the unfamiliar yet welcoming atmosphere, easily brought us into the routine of Brown.

As sophomores the Class of 1964 elected Jerry Baker as its class president, Bobby Simpson as vice-president, Sharoyn Absher as secretary, Rocky Fisher as treasurer, and Marla Moore and Harold Nelms as Student Council Representatives. Our sophomore class faculty advisor was Mr. John T. Mast.

Even in the sophomore year members of our class were beginning to take an active role in the leadership of the school. The Key Club accepted Jerry Baker, Bobby Field, Rocky Fisher, and Harold Nelms into its membership. Marla Moore, Jerry Baker, and Bobby Field were tapped into the National Honor Society. In addition to those clubs whose members are elected, members of our class were quick to join nearly every other club in the school.

Near the end of our first year at Brown, Marla Moore was elected treasurer, and Janet Richardson was elected secretary of the student body for the coming year.

We moved into our junior year as a class which had become as much a part of the school and its character as had any class before it. Though not yet possessing the self-assurance and confident attitude which was to come, we were gradually gaining those qualities which come with maturity. After having been at Brown for a year we were in a unique position of anticipation coupled with experience.

Having been through one football season, our cheers were louder and more meaningul the second time, and each of us was a bit prouder when we could say that we were from Brown.

Rocky Fisher was our class president in our junior year, David Brewer was vice-president, Karen Allen was secretary, Harry Hancock was treasurer, and Judy Carter and Bobby Simpson were our council members. Our junior class advisor was Miss Mary Alice Elliot.

When we became juniors, members of our class took on added responsibilities and honors in the school. Jerry Baker was elected vice-president of the Key Club, Harold Nelms was elected treasurer, Bobby Field was elected chaplain, and Bobby Simpson was added to the regular membership. Sharoyn Absher was elected Junior Miss Hi Miss, and Janet Richardson was chosen the only junior member of the cheerleaders. The National Thespian So-

ciety took into its membership Sharoyn Absher, Gail Belk, Judy Davis, Becky Reeder, and Ted Slaughter.

The junior year will probably be remembered as one of the best. It was the year our class went to Washington, and it was the year we received our class rings. As a class we sponsored the Junior-Senior Dance, and presented **Ask Any Girl** as our junior class play.

Near the end of the year Johnny Foutz and Bobby Simpson were elected by the school to serve as president and vice-president of the student body for the coming year. The school selected Marla Moore and Carol Hammett to serve as cheerleaders and Janet Richardson to serve as chief cheerleader. The staff elected Dorothy Whitaker to serve as editor of the school newspaper.

When we at last became Seniors each of us knew that the class had come a long way since it had first entered Brown. There were, of course, visible changes in each of us, but the more important changes were those which could not be so easily seen. We were now older and more mature. Though not lacking in our readiness to have a good time, we were now more able to take on the responsibilities which we were expected to assume.

As seniors we elected David Brewer our president, Janet Richardson our vice-president, Cynthia Kobulnicky our secretary, Sharoyn Absher our treasurer, Pat Kinney our chaplain, Judy Carter and Harry Hancock as our council members. Later in the year Karen Allen was chosen for a council seat. The faculty advisor to our senior class was Miss Loraine Gray.

Members of our class led the school in most areas. David Brewer, Harry Hancock, and Lawrence Braxton were taken into the Key Club, while Jerry Baker was made president and Rocky Fisher was made vice-president of the club. The National Honor Society elected Marla Moore as its president. Sharoyn Absher was elected Miss Brown High, and went on to be crowned Miss Merry Christmas and to become a Carrousel Princess. The school elected Nelda Rich as its Homecoming Queen, and Janet Richardson was chosen May Queen. In the field of athletics, Kenneth Gibson and Rocky Fisher were two of the three captains of our football team.

We chose as our class mascots Kim Renee Davis and Mark Edward Hubbard. Our class motto was "The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Our class colors were peach and gold, and the class flower was the Talisman Rose.

The combined impressions and experiences of the preceding years all go together to make the senior year what it is. It becomes the culmination of our high school careers and the climax of what are probably the most enjoyable and important years of our lives.

The senior year is the most important because it is the year of the greatest accomplishment. When one becomes a senior he has completed twelve years of his education, and he has a right to be proud. It is now that we must make the decisions which will shape our futures, and it is only now that we are able to do so.

But the senior year is a brief thing and it passes quickly. Graduation comes too soon. The thing which we have been working toward so long comes finally as an interruption rather than a relief. But it does come, and we accept it. We cross the stage and receive our diplomas. We become alumni and the Class of 1964 becomes a memory.


