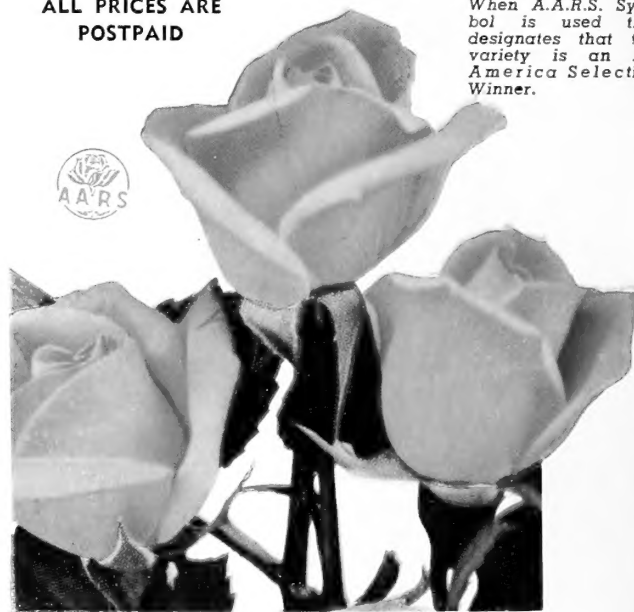

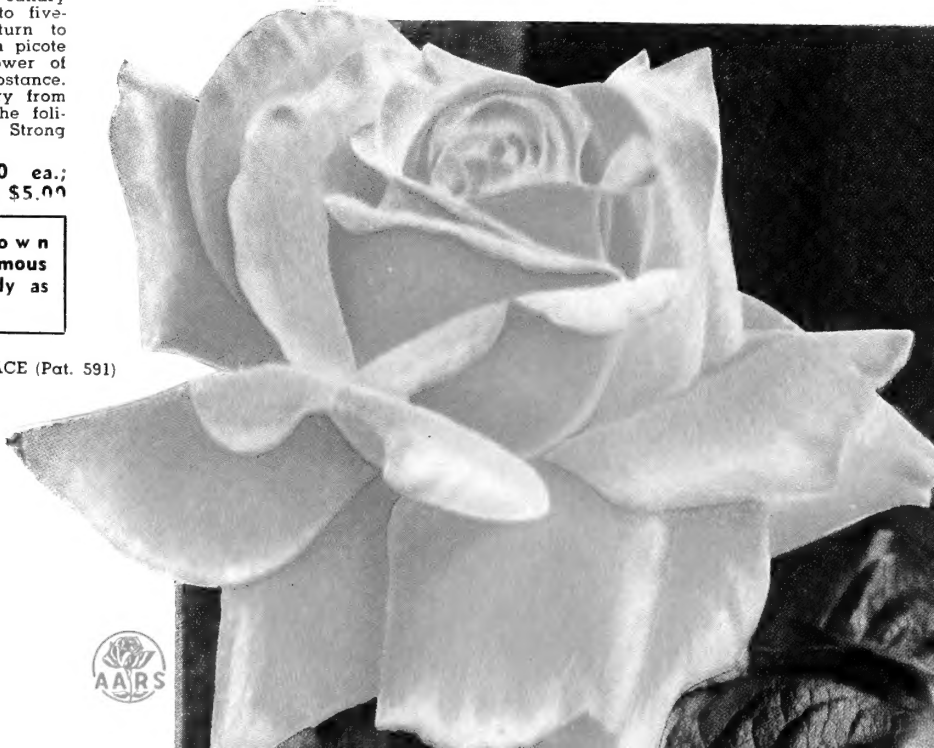

The name "Eclipse" came about because the seedling bloomed for the first time on the day of the total eclipse, August, 1932, and it was sent out with the slogan, "It Eclipses 'em all."

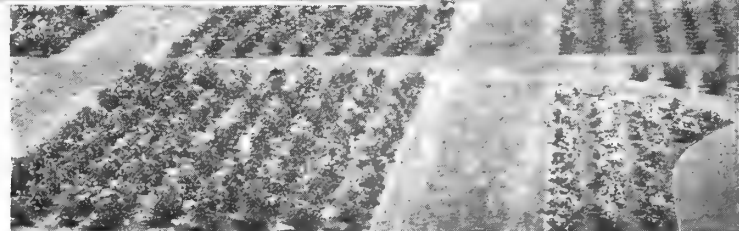

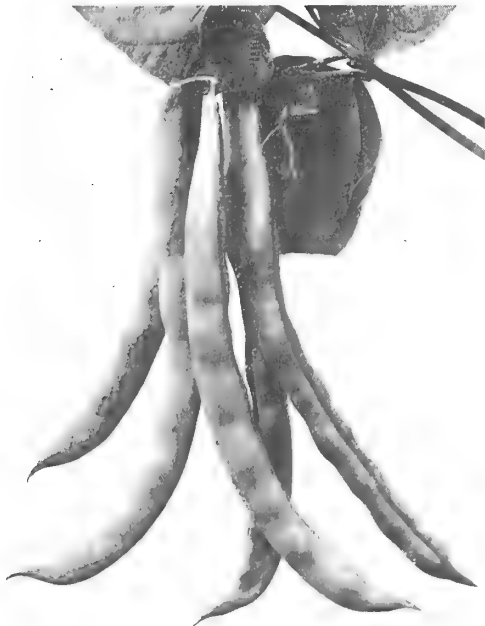
