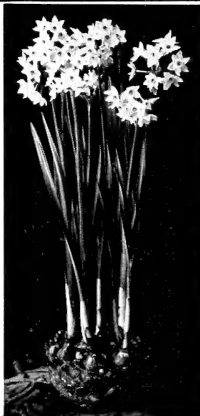

Our Prepared Bulb Fiber is a clean, odorless substitute for soil and can be used in fancy bowls with no drainage required. It is composed of granulated peat moss, oyster shells, soil, leaf mold, and impregnated with a long lasting fertilizer to assure large, healthy blooms.

Simply soak the fiber in a container of water allowing it to absorb all the water it can hold. Then squeeze as you would a sponge and plant the bulbs in the moist fiber. Firm the fiber around the bulbs but do not pack.

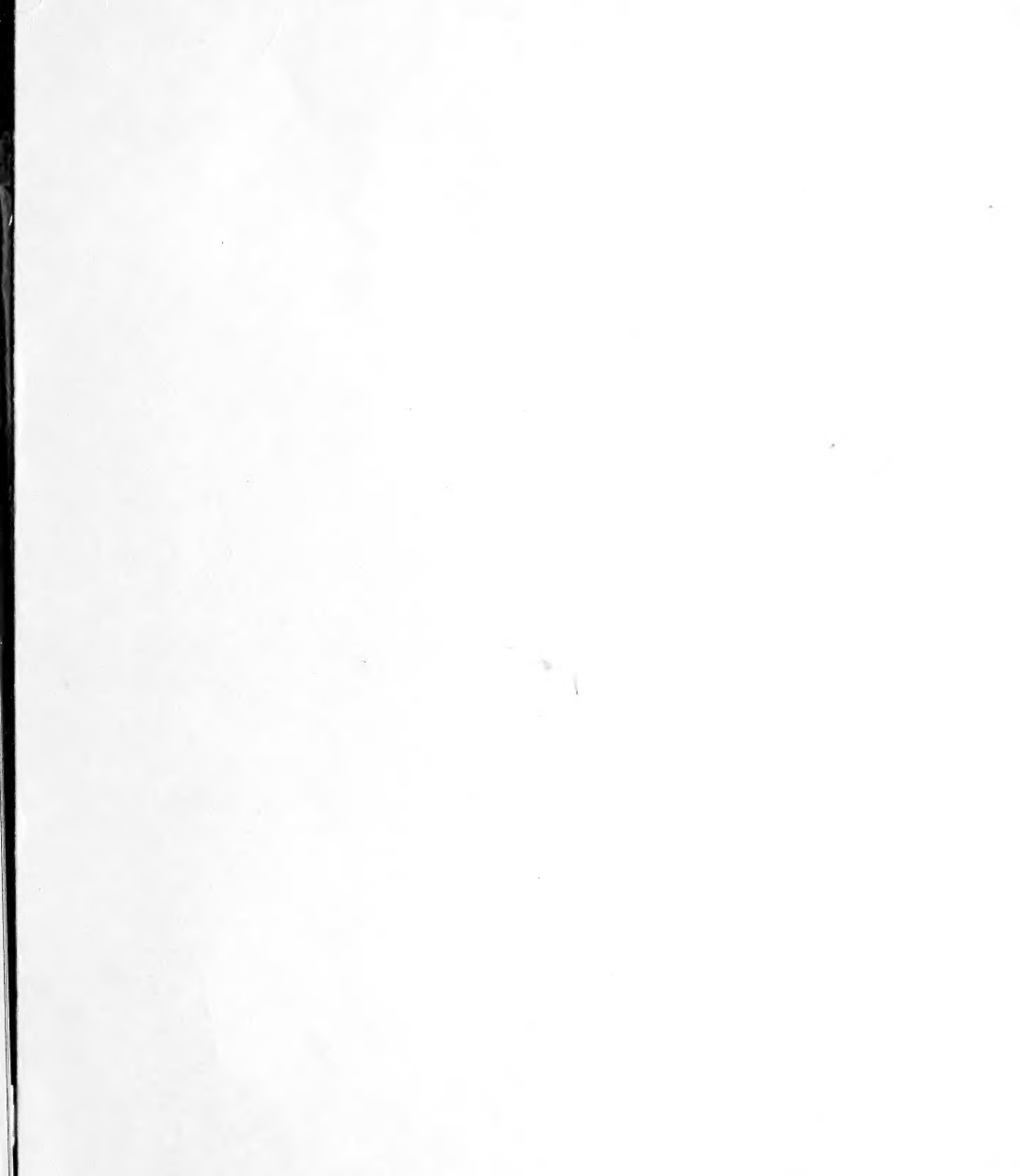
If the situation abroad should change, in sufficient time, so that we are assured we can receive a shipment from Holland, we will issue a special Tulip catalog.

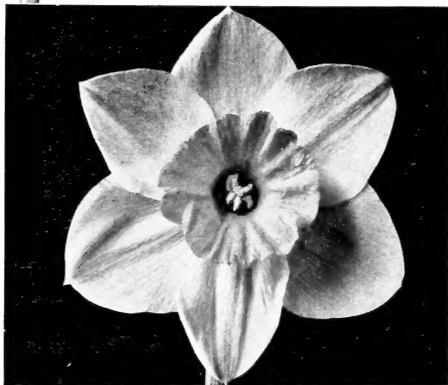

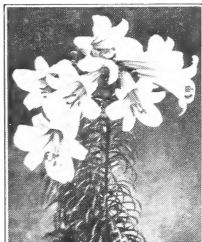
