FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

of the

MONTANA HORSE RACING COMMISSION

TO HIS EXCELLENCY, TIM BABCOCK, GOVERNOR OF MONTANA:

The Montana Horse Racing Commission respectfully wishes to transmit the following account of its' stewardship for the calendar year, January 1, 1968 through December 31, 1968, in accordance with section 62-504, Chapter 196, Laws of Montana 1965.

The 1968 Racing Season was comprised of sixty-two (62) racing days and resulted in a total mutuel handle of \$1,461,287.00 representing an increase of 15.70% over the year 1967. The following racing dates were granted and track licenses issued by the Commission for the 1968 Racing Season:

The Central Montana Fair held its first two day race meet under the supervision of the Montana Horse Racing Commission and reported a successful meet. They have applied for an additional day for their 1969 race meet.

A total of 723 persons were employed by Racing Associations; the total attendance was 126,530 and the sum of \$164,784.15 was paid to horsemen. A large percentage of the money paid to horsemen is retained in Montana for payment of transportation, lodging and food, and largest of all is the money spent by everyone who derives his income from racing in simple purchases which he must make every day from which our local citizens benefit and profit.



A total of 1302 licenses were issued to persons connected with racing, 16 track licenses and 9 stable names were registered, yielding a total of \$5,822.00. Before such persons were issued a license they were thoroughly screened. Nine persons were fined for violation of the law or rules and regulations and one person was denied a license due to a suspension against him in the State of Washington.

It is with pleasure that we report the continuing increase of the racing program and are indeed proud of the fact that the Montana citizen attending racing events at which there is pari-mutuel wagering may do so with complete confidence that every possible protection is afforded to the public interest under the close scrutiny of competent and qualified personnel.

The Commission is further proud of the fact that pari-mutuel wagering in Montana contributes a substantial financial support to the Fairs, also to the encouragement of the breeding industry. A total of 208 races or forty per cent of all races in 1968 were won by Montana bred horses, resulting in payment of \$3,114.17 to the breeders of such horses.

The use of Photo Finish was expanded to twelve tracks and Film Patrol to seven tracks in 1968, and again proved its value as a great aid to the Stewards in determining the finishing positions and infractions during the running of races.

In its efforts to protect the public by preventing illegal drugging of race horses, the Montana Livestock Sanitary Board Diagnostic Laboratory of Bozeman analyzed 520 samples. Seven official positives were reported to the Commission which took appropriate action.

The Montana Horse Racing Commission is a member of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners with headquarters in Lexington, Kentucky. The principal purpose of the Association is to serve as a central exchange for all rulings and information on racing activities. The NASRC also encourages the adoption of State Racing Commissions of uniform procedures and reciprocity in enforcing rules, regulations and penalties.



The Montana Horse Racing Commission has been honored by the President of the NASRC who has appointed Mr. Robert B. Murray to the Information and Public Relations Committee and Mr. Hugh Peltz to the Illegal Practices Committee.

The Commission amended and made additions to the rules and regulations, particularly the Veterinarian, Medication and Drug rules which were approved by the Advisory Committee of the Montana Veterinary Medical Association to further control the illegal use of drugs or any foreign substances which may affect the outcome of a race.

Horse Racing in Montana has developed under the jurisdiction of the Racing Commission into a dignified and prosperous enterprise, as well as to one of the most entertaining of all sports.

We present herewith the annual Pari-Mutuel Report and Statement of Financial Position (Exhibit A) and related exhibits, Results of Financial Operations (Exhibit B), Cash Summary (Exhibit C) for the calendar year ended December 31, 1968.

CONCLUSION

It is with extreme pleasure that we, the members of the Commission, extend our most sincere thanks and appreciation to His Excellency Governor Tim Babcock for his kind and patient cooperation and help.

The Commission acknowledges with gratitude the assistance and cooperation of the Attorney General, the State Auditor, the State Treasurer, the Montana Veterinary Medical Association, the Livestock Sanitary Board, the Livestock Commission and other Public Officials, as well as various Racing Persons, the Press and the Public.

It is with sincere feeling of satisfaction that the Racing Commission, being fully cognizant of the broad and demanding obligation of the trust reposed in it's supervision of racing in Montana, submits to you this Annual Report. We, who serve as your Commission, governing and regulating horse racing in Montana, realize there must be no lowering of the high standards which make racing the appealing and attractive sport it is.




