# **Centre Harbor Town Meeting**

March 2, 1976

Total Number of Names on Checklist — 354 Total Number of Ballots Cast — 88

The March second, nineteen hundred seventy six Town Meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M. by the Moderator, L. Keith Matheson who announced that the voting would be restricted to Articles 1A and 1B.

At 7:00 P.M. a motion was made by Robert Beem and seconded by Lewis Hanson that action on articles 1A and 1B be suspended and the meeting be resumed in the fire station at 7:30 P.M. where Articles 2 through 29 be acted upon before completing Articles 1A and 1B. This motion was voted in the affirmative.

At 7:30 P.M. when the meeting reopened, Robert Beem moved that we have the meeting with no smoking. This was seconded by Barbara Parshley. The vote was in the affirmative. A salute to the flag was given before we proceeded to Article 2.

ARTICLE 2. On the motion of John Bankosh it was moved and seconded by Mary Fisher to see if the town will raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. The sum being \$56,190.00. This was voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 3. On the motion of Robert Beem it was moved and seconded by Gertrude Martin to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$36,750.00 for the maintenance of town highways and bridges, including sidewalks and dead tree removal. Lewis Hanson made an amendment to have the amount raised to \$37,950. This was seconded by John Bankosh. Mr. Bankosh then explained the reason and the amendment was voted in the affirmative. The original motion amended was then voted in the affirmative

ARTICLE 4. On the motion of John Desmond it was moved and seconded by Bess Hanson to see if the town will vote to accept state assistance for Class V roads and, if so, to raise the sum of \$297.34. (The state will contribute the sum of \$4,982.30 provided this Article is voted in the affirmative). The motion was voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 5. On the motion of Lewis Hanson it was moved and seconded by Dennis Parshley to see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$16,000.00 for the purposes of completing the improvements of Bartlett Hill Road. \$4,500.00 to be paid from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and the balance of \$11,500.00 be raised through the issuance of notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter

241, New Hampshire revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Centre Harbor. The moderator asked all in favor to say aye and all those opposed say nay. As there were no "nays" it was unanimously voted in the affirmative and the moderator so declared.

ARTICLE 6. By motion of William Montgomery it was moved and seconded by Mary-Knowles Macgregor to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,800.00 for the maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department to be paid from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund, and authorize the Centre Harbor Volunteer Firemen's Association to expend said sum for the operation and maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department. Affirmative Vote.

ARTICLE 7. On the motion of Carl R. Marshall it was moved and seconded by Louise deSousa to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,490.00 for the operation of the Police Department: \$8,790.00 to be raised by taxes in 1976 and the balance of \$1,700.00 to be paid from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 8. On the motion of Dennis Parshley it was moved and seconded by Mary Fisher to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the operation of the Library. This motion was voted in the affirmative

ARTICLE 9. On the motion of Lewis Hanson it was moved and seconded by Ronald Ulm to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of providing ambulance service to the Town. Because there were no objections, the moderator gave Mr. Crumb permission to answer a few questions in regard to what this service provided. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 10. On the motion of Frank Muscarella it was moved and seconded by Mary Fisher to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,645.00 for Parks & Playgrounds including Band Concerts, hiring of a Life Guard at the Winnipesaukee Town Beach, care and maintenance of Wharf and Fountain & beach area, and to include Holiday Celebrations. This motion was voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 11. On the motion of Mary-Knowles Macgregor it was moved and seconded by Elloyd Weeks to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Centre Harbor Historical Society: (Funds to assist in the renovation of the old Centre Harbor School). Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 12. On the motion of Robert Beem it was moved and seconded by Bess Hanson to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for Welfare and Town Poor. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 13. On the motion of Mary-Knowles Macgregor it was

moved and seconded by Minnie Nichols to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$133.22 for the support of the Lakes Region Association. This motion was voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 14. On the motion of Mary Fisher it was moved and seconded by Minnie Nichols to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the support of the Child and Family Services of New Hampshire. Minnie Nichols explained that the name had been changed and made an amendment to the motion to read Lakes Region Family Services instead of Child & Family Services of New Hampshire. The amendment was then voted in the affirmative. The original motion as amended was then voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 15. On the motion of Lewis Hanson it was moved and seconded by Dennis Parshley to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 for the support of the New Hampshire Humane Society. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 16. On a motion by Y. Ann Dow it was moved and seconded by Ronald Ulm to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 as a contribution to support the Lakes Region Hospital. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 17. On a motion by Mary-Knowles Macgregor it was moved and seconded by Gale White to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 as a contribution to support the Huggins Hospital. Affirmative vote.

A five minute recess was declared by the Moderator

ARTICLE 18. On motion by Janet Hooper it was moved and seconded by Kathy Bankosh to see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$500.00 for the support of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 19. On motion of Earl B. Coudert it was moved and seconded by Eloise Coudert to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,230.50 to help maintain and continue the delivery system of services to the poor through the Laconia Community Action Program, Inc. After much discussion a count was taken. The vote was 18 yes and 10 no.

ARTICLE 20. On motion of Janet Hooper it was moved and seconded by Mary-Knowles Macgregor to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$559.00 for the support of Lakes Region Community Health Agency, Inc. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 21. On motion of Barbara Benoit it was moved and seconded by Mary-Knowles Macgregor to see if the Town will vote accept the Hosea Canny Trust. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 22. On motion of Dennis Parshley it was moved and seconded by Lyndol Pocock to see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on taxes paid in full within fifteen days of issue of the tax bills by the Tax Collector. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 23. On motion of Robert Heath it was moved and seconded

by Ronald Ulm to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 24. On motion of Gale White it was moved and seconded by Janet Hooper to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive and expend federal and state funds on behalf of the Town of Centre Harbor. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 25. On motion of Lewis Hanson it was moved and seconded by John Bankosh to see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell property acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed. The motion was voted in the affirmative.

ARTICLE 26. Under this article to choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the warrant and hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen, Lewis Hanson reappointed the Historical Society as the committee on restoration of cemeteries.

ARTICLE 27. On motion by Rob Roy Macgregor it was moved and seconded by Barbara Benoit to see if the Town will vote to grant site plan review authority to the Planning Board in accordance with RSA 36:19a in order to maintain proper control over non-residential development. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 28. On motion by Robert Heath and seconded by Lewis Woodaman to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 toward the construction of a new bathhouse for the Winnipesaukee Town Beach. Affirmative vote.

ARTICLE 29. On motion of John Merrill it was moved and seconded by Dennis Parshley to see if the Town will vote to enact the following bylaw: Relative to Fire Protection in the Town of Centre Harbor, be it ordained by the Town of Centre Harbor:

Section 1. Appointment of Firewards and Fire Chief

On or before the first day of April in 1976 and February thereafter the Selectmen shall appoint a Fire Chief and two assistants, the three of whom shall be the firewards of the Town of Centre Harbor and who shall serve for a term of one year or until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified.

Section 2. Firewards, Qualifications, Recommendations

No person shall be appointed to the position of Fire Chief or assistant Fire Chief unless he shall be qualified by education, training or experience in the suppression and prevention of fires; and unless he shall have been recommended for said position by the Centre Harbor Volunteer Fire Department.

Section 3. Firewards, Duties, Powers

The Firewards shall have the powers and duties provided for in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated. Chapter 154, as amended.

Section 4. Fire Chief, Powers and Duties

The Fireward appointed as Fire Chief shall have the powers

and duties provided for in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Title XII as amended.

Section 6. Volunteer Fire Department Recognized.

Any action taken by the Centre Harbor Volunteer Fire Department or any member thereof pursuant to or in the enforcement of the statutes of the State of New Hampshire, under the direction of the firewards, shall, for all purposes be deemed to be action taken by the Town of Centre Harbor.

### Section 7. Effective Date

This by-law shall take effect upon its passage.

After this article was explained and discussed, it was recommended that Section 6 be called Section 5 and that Section 7 be called Section 6. With the consent of John Merrill (who made the motion) and Dennis Parshley (who seconded the motion) it was incorporated in the original article. Affirmative vote.

At 8:50 p.m. the polls were re-opened for ten minutes for those who had not yet voted on Articles 1A and 1B. The moderator then closed the poles at 9:00 p.m. and the votes were then counted with the following results:

# **Town Warrant**

State of New Hampshire

Belknap SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Centre Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Cary H. Mead Meeting Room (Municipal Building) in said Centre Harbor on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. The sum being \$58,876.17.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$42,685.00 for the maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges, including sidewalks, dead tree removal, Dock & Fountain.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$11,250.00 for the Centre Harbor share of using the Meredith Refuse Disposal Facility and to authorize the selectmen to conclude an agreement with the Town of Meredith to permit Centre Harbor to utilize the Meredith Refuse Disposal Facility in accordance with conditions acceptable to the Centre Harbor Board of Selectmen. (If this article is voted in the affirmative, Centre Harbor residents and property owners will be subject to the rules and ordinances of the Refuse Disposal Facility.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept state assistance for Class V roads and, if so, to raise the sum of \$295.84. (The state will contribute the sum of \$1,972.25 provided this article is voted in the affirmative.) The total sum will be applied to the repayment of the Bartlett Hill Advanced Town Road Aid notes as voted in 1976.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,200.00 for the maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department, and authorize the Centre Harbor Volunteer Fireman's Association to expend said sum for the operation and maintenance of the Centre Harbor Fire Department, the amount to be paid from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. for a Capital Reserve Fund toward the purchase of a new fire truck.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,050.00 for the operation of the Police Department. (\$7,800 to be paid from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund, Balance of \$3,250.00 to be raised by taxes.)

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the operation of the Library.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of providing ambulance service to the Town.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,045.00 for Parks and Recreation, to include Band Concerts, Holiday Celebrations and Lifeguard. (\$296.00 to be paid from the anti-Recession Fiscal Assistance Program, the balance of \$4,749.00 to be raised by taxes.)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the completion of a new bathhouse for the Winnipesaukee Town Beach.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for Welfare and Town Poor.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the support of the Lakes Region Association. (\$146.20 requested for 1977--\$139.33 appropriated in 1976).

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the support of the Lakes Region Family Service. (\$150.00 requested for 1977--\$150.00 appropriated in 1976.)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Centre Harbor Historical Society. (Funds to be used for the continued renovation of the Old Centre Harbor School.)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate funds for the support of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center. (\$682.50 requested for 1977-\$500.00 appropriated in 1976.)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the support of the Laconia Community Action Program. (\$1,287.80 requested for 1977--\$1,230.50 appropriated in 1976.)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the support of the Meredith Public Health Nursing Association. (\$350.00 requested for 1977--\$559.00 appropriated for Lakes Region Community Health Agency, Inc. in 1976.)

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the support of the Lakes Region Community Health Agency, Inc. (\$645.00 requested for 1977--\$559.00 appropriated in 1976.)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on taxes paid in full within fifteen days of issue of the tax bills by the Tax Collector.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, receive, and expend federal and state funds on behalf of the Town of Centre Harbor.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by the Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 25. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of the warrant and hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.

# The Lakes Region Community Health Agency, Inc.

On December 1, 1976 the Lakes Region Community Health Agency, Inc. entered into its second year of service to residents of the Town of Center Harbor. Our first year has seen a broadening of the Agency's financial stability, a steady increase in demand for our services, and further development of staff and programs in response to this demand.

The current scope of services to Center Harbor includes professional skilled nursing care and other community health projects, such as free blood pressure screening clinics. Working as a team under the direction of the patient's physician, we are able to provide the most appropriate and economical level of care in response to our patient's needs. The availability of our services has enabled many members of the local community to retain their independence and remain in their own homes during a period of illness or infirmity when it would not be otherwise possible.

Town appropirations are applied to defray those costs of services which are not reimbursable through available third party sources as Medicare, Medicaid, and Title XX. We feel that the local funds that are allocated to the Lakes Region Community Health Agency are a sound investment for the residents of Center Harbor as they enable us to deliver a return of necessary quality services. We are your community health agency, serving you.

# Inter-Lakes Day Care Center Report To The Towns

During the calendar year 1976 the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center served one hundred thirty one children from Lakes Region families. The Center operates a pre-school program for comprehensive child behavior and development with a full range of services including education, health care, periodic vision and hearing screening, immunizations, dental care, nutrition and information and referral. We also participate in the New Hampshire Special Food Service Program offering a daily hot lunch, breakfast, and nutritious snacks. The Center is in operation on a year-round basis from 6:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., making it possible for the parents of sixty children to maintain employment.

The primary concern of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center is to provide a home-like, educational environment for children of working parents. We also offer a nursery school program and an after-school program for elementary school children.

The total budget of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center is \$64,091.50. Of this we will be receiving \$18,720.00 in tuition paid by parents, \$13,975.00 from Aid to Families with Dependent Children, and \$25,709.00 in federal funds, and \$5,687.50 which must be obtained in local funding in order to receive the federal amounts. The money we receive from the towns that we serve is matched three times.

Area residents are always invited to visit the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center at 11 Lang Street in Meredith.

### Report of the Planning Board

The Planning Board scheduled 24 regular meetings and 2 public hearings in 1976.

During the year 17 subdivision proposals were submitted to the board. After review by the board and public hearings 12 were approved and 1 disapproved. Four subdivision proposals were carried over to 1977. One of the approved subdivisions was a major one for more than five lots.

Following the public hearings some Amendments were adopted to clarify the Zoning Ordinance in regard to Home Occupations, Building Permits. Signs and Use of Shorefront Lots.

In November the Planning Board accepted with deep regret the resignation of Rob Roy Macgregor, who had served on the board since 1967. He will be sorely missed and the board is proposing that the town join the board in expressing appreciation for the many services that Rob Roy Macgregor has rendered to Centre Harbor by adopting the following resolution at Town Meeting.

WHEREAS, Rob Roy Macgregor served on the Centre Harbor Planning Board from 1967 through 1976, as Chairman from 1967 to 1972, and thereafter as Secretary until his retirement in December 1976, and

WHEREAS, he was a pioneer in the development of the regulations for administering the activities of the Planning Board and was the representative of Centre Harbor to the Lakes Region Planning Commission, and

WHEREAS, he was instrumental in the creation of the Centre Harbor Conservation Commission,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT WE, in Town Meeting this eighth day of March 1977 wish to record an expression of very sincere appreciation to Mr. Macgregor for his voluntary service to the town and for his initiative and able leadership in the development and administration of our successful Planning Board program and be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to Mr. Macgregor as a token of the high esteem we hold for him in his unselfish expenditure of time and energy to help make Centre Harbor such a fine place in which to live.

The board will also miss the services of Mrs. Mary Knowles Macgregor who has served the board as recording secretary.

#### **Annual Report**

The Meredith CAP Outreach Office has continued to provide comprehensive services to the Centre Harbor community during 1976. Besides improving the quality of present programs, we have added new ones which we believe are especially well suited to the needs of our low income and elderly families. The following are programs which are available to financially eligible Centre Harbor residents and to senior citizens.

#### Information and Referral

A service which is available to all, "I & R" provides information on social services, employment, child care, consumer education, health, nutrition, and housing. When appropriate, referrals are made to other agencies who can provide direct help in meeting specific needs.

#### Housing

CAP can provide assistance to eligible Centre Harbor residents in various housing-related areas, including the Weatherization Program, (distribution of plastic, weatherstripping, and insulation), the Heat for Elderly and Low income Persons (HELP) Fuel Loan Program, and fuel utility assistance. Energy conservation information is also available.

#### Food Coop

Tally, bag, cashier, label meat, cut cheese, mop floors or remove trash, Centre Harbor volunteers help make our coop one of the most successful in two counties. Membership has doubled and the variety of foods has been greatly expanded. Consumer education in our coop stresses comparison shopping and when local merchants offer lower prices, coop members are urged to take advantage of such specials.

#### Family Planning Program

New evening clinics, outreach work, and improved community education efforts have increased the number of Centre Harbor women enrolled in the Family Planning Program. In addition to medical care, patients may request VD tests, pregnancy tests, counseling, and educational services, all free of charge.

#### Rural Transportation

The Belknap County Rural Transportation Service is designed to help senior citizens and low income persons in need of transportation to medical and dental appointments, shopping, senior citizen activities, and various other errands. One day each week, the RTS bus provides round-trip service from Centre Harbor to Laconia with stops wherever riders request.

#### **Operation Green Thumb**

Vegetable seed, tomato plants, seed potatoes and fertilizer were distributed during May and early June of this year. Most participants grew enough food for summer consumption, and even for freezing and canning.

#### **Elderly Nutrition Program**

Besides Meals on Wheels and Congregate Meals, the Elderly Nutrition Program also provides Centre Harbor's Senior Citizens with Information and Referral, Counseling, Escort Service, Shopping Assistance, Nutrition Education, and Recreation. Our own passenger van is available for field trips and for transportation of Congregate Meals clients from their homes to the meal site. Residents of Twin Gates Manor Group Home have become regular participants in our Congregate Meals program, and because of the Salvation Army's generosity, our office was able to provide them with many useful articles of clothing at Christmas.

#### Senior Companion Program

Through a grant from ACTION, Belknap-Merrimack CAP will be sponsoring a new senior volunteer program which will provide the volunteer with a weekly stipend and will be serving adults with special needs.

#### Telephone Reassurance Service

In early 1977, volunteers at the Meredith CAP office will begin a Telephone Reassurance Service. Anyone who wishes to participate may call 279-4096 during regular business hours.

# Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

#### Center Harbor

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to a three year term.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and in such places as the fire warden deems as safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage loss due to forest fires in the United States for the past 20 years.
