Visitors coming from New York, via Hudson River Railroad, should stop at Dutchess Junction, or via Harlem Railroad, at Millerton, where the New York, Boston and Montreal Railroad connects for Fishkill.

Owing to the splendid growing season, we are prepared to offer a much larger and finer assortment of stock in general than we have ever before offered, and invite a personal inspection. We call especial attention to our stock of Evergreens, of which we make quite a speciality; would say they are every way first-class, having been transplanted from one to four times and cut back, consequently are in the best possible condition for transplanting, and when properly done seldom ever fail to grow.

ORDERS.

PACKING.

All orders are carefully packed in bales or boxes, for which a charge is made sufficient to cover cost of material. All packages delivered free of charge at the depot or express office at Fishkill or Fishkill Landing, or at the boats at Fishkill Landing, and properly receipted for, after which they are at the risk of the purchaser.

Orders from unknown correspondents, unless accompanied by cash or satisfactory reference, will be sent by express C. O. D. and R. C. All claims for errors and deficiencies must be made within ten days after receipt of the stock. We desire to be notified of mistakes as early as possible, so we can rectify the same without delay.
