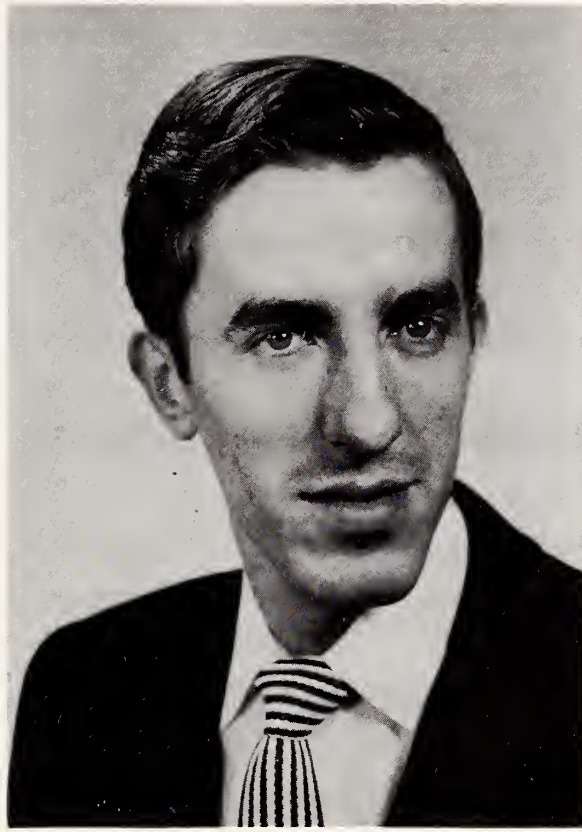




Foreword
