Austin was the leading scorer with 262 points. Jones was second with 206, followed by Gragg with 133 and Clarke with 112.


Coach Hathaway described his team as a hard-working, co-operative group of boys who gave the game everything they had at all times.


In the Caldwell County Conference the H. V. boys ended with a 7-7 record for fourth place in an eight-team conferenc.
