

East Montgomery is a very fine school and one that anyone should be proud to attend. The atmosphere, surroundings, and student enthusiasm have made this school one of high quality and character.


It is our hope that the students of the years following will uphold and grow with the true character of East. It is our wish that they will enjoy the fond memories and the deep influence that we have felt.
