The science club plans its activities mainly around biology, chemistry, physics, astronomy, and general science.



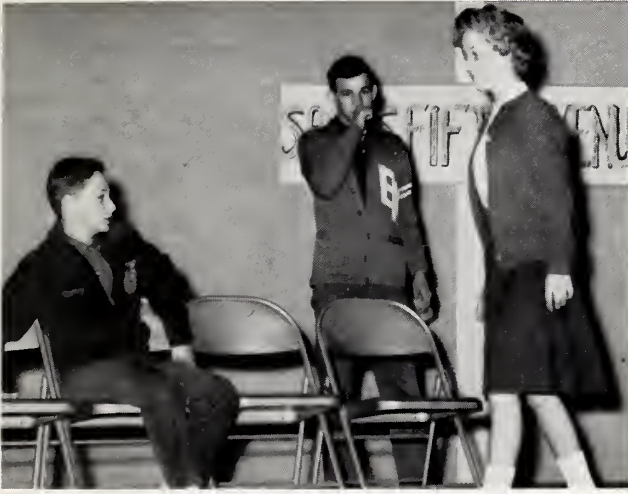
