As the year draws to a close, the students prepare to leave behind another chapter of life, the chapter recorded in the 1964 AQULLA. They remember the joys of the past year, the successes, and the three concepts which guided them. May truth, light, and liberty continue to guide them in the years ahead, and may they ever desire "to strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield."
