IN MEMORIAM

On Tuesday, May 23, 1967, the Surry Central High School District lost a long-time and dedicated member and chairman of the school committee. Prior to the consolidation of the Copeland, Dobson, and Mountain Park schools, he served many years as a member of the Copeland School Committee. His passing was a great personal loss not only to his family and friends, but also to the teachers and students of our community.

He was vitally concerned that Surry Central have a top-

notch instructional program for its students and was one of the strongest supporters of the Athletic Program.

Bob Burrus was a man with a keen interest in all civic and community endeavors. He believed in community development through better roads, schools, churches, and a Community College.

His leadership, sense of humor, words of encouragement, friendliness, and his firm but gentle hand will be missed by all of us.




GUIDANCE AND LIBRARY
