#### Letter Post.

To and from all parts of the United Kingdom:—Not exceeding \$\( \frac{1}{4} \) to 6 oz., \$\( \frac{1}{4} \) to 6 oz., \$\( \frac{1}{4} \) to 6 oz., \$\( \frac{1}{4} \) to 8 oz. at the rate of \$\( \frac{1}{4} \) d for every additional 2 oz. Dimensions—24 ins. in length, \$12\$ in, in width, and \$12\$ in, in depth. No limit in weight. A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage, and a letter posted insufficiently paid is charged double the deficiency. The penny stamp now issued can be used either as a postage or receipt stamp. Postage to India, British Colonies, and Protectorates are now charged 1d per \$\( \frac{1}{2} \) oz.

#### Post Cards.

Post-cards, available for transmission in the United Kingdom only, are sold at 10 for 54d, for of finer quality 10 for 6d. They can also be had in smaller numbers or singly. Plain cards, with adhesive 1d stamp affixed, may also be used. Reply cards, five for 6d. Letter cards. 8 for 9d; smaller numbers in proportion. Foreign post-cards, 1d each; reply, 2d.

#### Inland Book Post.

The Book Post rate is one half-penny for 2 oz. Packets exceeding 2 oz. in weight are sent at letter rate. Every book packet must be posted either without a cover or in a cover entirely open at the ends.

#### Postage on Registered Newspapers.

On each Registered Newspaper, the postage, when prepaid, is \( \frac{1}{2} d. \) No packet of newspapers must exceed 14 lbs. in weight, or 2 ft. in length, or 1 ft. in width or depth.

#### Redirection.

Tetters, cards, newspapers, books, and samples are redirected free of charge. Cards, newspapers, and books which cannot be delivered, and upon which a postage fee of one halfpenny only has been prepaid, are chargeable with fresh postage when returned to the senders.

#### Post Office Telegrams.

The charge for telegrams throughout the United Kingdom is 6d for 12 words, and ½d for every additional word. Addresses are charged for. Postage stamps are used for payment.

#### Post Office Telephones.

Sixpence for three minutes' conversation within a radius of 25 miles; ninepence for 50 miles, and so on.

#### Money Orders for the United Kingdom.

Money Orders are granted in the United Kingdom as follows:—For sums not exceeding £1, 2d; £3, 3d; £10, 4d. Money may now be sent by Telegraph Money Order at the following rates of commission — for sums not exceeding £3, 4d; above £3 and not exceeding £10, 6d. In addition to the commission, a charge is made at the ordinary inland rate for the official' telegram of advice. Minimum charge, 6d.

### Money Orders Payable Abroad

are granted in the United Kingdom as follows—On sums not exceeding £2, 6d; £6, 1s; £10, 1s 6d.

#### Postal Orders

Postal Orders for fixed sums are issued at the following rates:—On those for 1s and 1s 6d the charge is ½d: for 2s up to 10s 6d, 1d; for 15s and 20s, 1½d. Broken amounts may be made up with stamps affixed to the face of the order.

#### Parcel Post.

Parcels up to 11 lbs. in weight may be transmitted by the inland parcel post at the following rates—1 lb. and under, 3d, and 1d additional for every lb. up to 11 lbs.—maximum charge, 1s.

#### Registration and Compensation.

By the prepayment of a fee of 2d, any postal packet may be registered to any place in the Unit-d Kingdom, and in case of loss or damage, compensation, will be given by the Postmaster-General.

#### Post Office Savings Bank.

No deposit of less than a shilling is received, nor any pence, and not more than £50 in one year. No further deposit is allowed when the amount standing in depositor's name amounts to £200, inclusive of Interest is allowed at the rate of interest. 21 per cent. (or sixpence in the pound) per annum-that is, at the rate of one halfpenny per pound per month. Separate accounts may be opened in the names of wife and children. Any person can now invest at any Post Office Savings Bank small sums in Government Stock. The amount of Stock which can be purchased or sold at one time is now reduced to the nominal sum of 1s. Not more than £100 can be invested in any one year, and the total amount paid by any one investor must not exceed £300.

#### Government Insurance and Annuities.

The lives of persons of either sex between the ages of 14 and 65 may be insured for not less than £5 nor more than £100. The sums charged for deferred annuities, or deferred monthly allowances, vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life it is to depend, and with the conditions of the contract.

#### Licenses.



### Arbroath During the Year 1898.

HE opening of the Public Library Buildings in June is the most important event in the history of Arbroath for the year 1898. The formal opening took place on Saturday, 4th June, and the occasion was celebrated by a procession of public bodies, volunteers, trades, friendly societies, &c. After Mr David Corsar, the donor of the buildings, had handed to Provost Grant the deed of gift, which made the Library Buildings for all time the property of the community, the door was opened by Mr Alexander Gordon, Ashludie, first Chairman of the Library Committee. Great interest was given to the event by the presence of the Right Hon. John Morley, M.P. for the Angus Burghs, who spoke to an enormous crowd at Hill Terrace, and also addressed a large gathering of gentlemen at a cake and wine banquet given by the Town Council, and held in the Town Hall. Sports were held at the Victoria Park; the principal streets were all decorated with flags, evergreens, &c., and the whole community made the celebration of the occasion worthy of the great cause with which it was associated.

Since its start the Library has proved exceedingly popular. From 6th June to 15th October the books issued from the Lending Department numbered 33,755; the readers' tickets issued numbering 4,458. The Reading and Reference Rooms have been visited by about 300 persons daily; and an exhibition of pictures organised by the Art Galleries Committee, under the energetic convenership of Mr Samuel Renny, attracted over 15,000 visitors.

Some difficulty having been experienced in meeting adequately all the expenses of the Institution by the ordinary revenue, Mr David Corsar intimated, with characteristic promptitude and generosity, a donation to the funds of £500, to be given in annual grants of £100, in order to secure the effective staffing of the Library. Mr Corsar's liberality was heartily appreciated by the Library Committee and by the community. A recommendation by the Directors of the Mechanics' Institute, that the resources of the Institute should be transferred to the Library Committee, was discussed at a meeting of members of the Institute held in September, when it was agreed, on the motion of Rev. Mr Douglas, to delay coming to any decision for six months.

In November Mr Alexander Gordon intimated to the Town Council his desire to retire from the Chairmanship of the Library Committee. The Town Council unanimously agreed to appoint Mr J. B. Salmond, the first honorary secretary of the Library Committee, to the vacancy caused by Mr Gordon's retiral. Mr Salmond, however, did not see his way to accept office. An effort was made to get Mr David Corsar to become a member of the Committee. Mr Corsar was unanimously appointed a member of the Library Committee by the Town Council, and accepted office; the new Library Committee, at its first meeting, appointed him chairman. The Town Council restored Dr T. F. Dewar to his place on the Committee, ex-Provost Keith and Mr E. J. Leslie being also elected to fill vacancies. Mr William Alexander, solicitor, has now been appointed secretary to the Library Committee at an annual salary of £12 12s.

The most interesting local publication of the year has been the "Visitors' Guide to Arbroath, its Abbey and the Cliffs" written by Mr J. B. Salmond, and published by Messrs Brodie & Salmond. Published in August it had an exceptionally large sale, both amongst Arbroathians and visitors. During the past four or five years there has been a striking increase in the number of summer visitors to Arbroath; in 1898 the incursion of visitors far surpassed all previous records, a very large number remaining in the burgh for some time as "summer lodgers." An interesting Bazaar Book, published by St Thomas Lodge of Freemasons (No. 40) on the occasion of the Lodge's Bazaar, may also be mentioned. It contained an interesting history of the Lodge—the oldest in the community—and its illustrations included a series of excellent portraits of the office-bearers of the Lodge and other well-known gentlemen.

PROVOST GRANT.

The Town Council and the Boards associated with it in the management of the town's affairs have had a busy year. Under the genial presidency of Provost Grant a great deal of business has been very pleasantly and effectively attended to. Town Council did not succeed the Postal inducing Authorities to bring forward their new Post Office to the High Street, and building operations are now proceeding on the site opposite the present office. In their appeal to the Railway Commissioners for better railway station accommodation, the Town Council was also unsuccessful; but it is believed

that the Railway Directors are very uneasy in their consciences regarding the flagrantinadequacy of Arbroath Station, and it is not unlikely that a new station may be in course of erection before the dawn of the new century. Important street improvements have been effected on High Street, at West Shore, and elsewhere; a great improvement is being effected by the removal of old buildings

at the Abbey Green; a new Public Bowling Green is in course of construction at Cairnie Wood; great additional improvements have been carried out on the seashore roadway at Victoria Park, which has now become one of the most popular recreative institutions in the town. The larger bell in the Town's Steeple having got cracked the Council has resolved to replace it, and to fix a complete peal of bells in the spire.

As Police Commissioners, the Town Councillors have been wrestling away all the year with the question of Water Supply. Mr Mansergh, London, was asked to come down from London and say whether the plans prepared for the construction of the Warslap adits were workable. Mr Mansergh advised con-

siderable changes, charged a handsome fee, and seemed very glad when he got his hands clear of the whole matter. Mr Mansergh's proposals have not been car-Two hundred yards of adits ried out. have now been driven; a fortnight's pumping test in November showed a supply of 113 gallons per head per day—the water being measured by meter. By a majority of one, the Police Commission resolved that an additional hundred vards of adit should be driven. so that the wells at Nolt Loan and Warslap might be connected. Local Government Board sent down its Medical Officer, Sir Henry Littlejohn, to report regarding the condition of the town's drainage and water supply.

Henry stated in his report that he had been informed that the water supply was to be increased to 16 gallons per head per day in January, 1899, and to 22 gallons per head per day by January, 1900. Mr McCulloch, the Commission's engineer, states that Sir Henry misunderstood what he said to him regarding increase of the supply. Sir Henry Littlejohn has as yet taken no notice of Mr McCulloch's statement, so that the Local Government Board, like the community, now waits to see the result of the extension of the adit.


The Commission has not yet been able to settle the Shambles question, although a great many probable sites have been examined and reported upon. There is, however, some expectation that a suitable site will be got before very long. The regular work of the Commission has been going on smoothly, and the ratepayers were gratified by a reduction of the Police Rate to the extent of ad per £. has been a great deal of Public Health business. Unfortunately whoopingcough, measles, and fever have been very prevalent; and the School Board recently called the special attention of the Medical Officer to the serious aspect of things which the continuance of scarlet fever presents.

The Burial Board has had no business of outstanding importance. Mr Rust the cemeteries continue to be excellently and economically managed. It has been agreed to feu some three or four acres of the land at Little Cairnie-the part adjoining the Hercules Burn-for the erection of an Epidemic Hospital, to serve both the burgh and the district under the care of the Arbroath District Committee of the County Council. Mr R. S. Carlow was able to present to the Gas Corporation a very satisfactory report on the year's business at the Gas Works. The Corporation has found it necessary to apply for extension of its borrowing powers, and a provisional order is also being applied for to enable the Corporation to introduce electric lighting

Considerable change has taken place in the personelle of the Town Council during the year. Bailie Cargill's death created a vacancy both in the Council and on the Magistrates' bench. Dr T. F. Dewar was unanimously elected interim representative of Abbey Ward, and Councillor Henderson was elected Third Bailie, Bailie Alexander and Bailie Melvin taking the first and second bailieships. At the elections in November four new members took their seats-Councillors E. J. Leslie, David Robbie, W. S. Watt, and John Dundas. Councillors Leslie, Watt, and Robbie took the seats rendered vacant by the retiral of Messrs Jarvis, Law, and Smith, none of whom sought re-election, and Councillor Dundas defeated Bailie Henderson in Keptie Ward.

At the first meeting of the reconstituted Town Council, Provost Grant was unanimously re-elected Chief Magistrate for three years. Bailies Alexander and Melvin were also re-elected, and the third chair was bestowed upon Dean of Guild Duncan, whose promotion gained general approval. Corsar was unanimously chosen Dean of Guild.

The first Parish Council of Arbroath and St. Vigeans completed its work during the year, and in November the new Council was elected, the election taking place on the same day and in the same polling stations as the Muncipal Elections. There were only two contested elections-Keptie and Abbey Wards. The result of the election was the introduction of four fresh burghal representatives, who took the places of four old members who did not seek re-election. Parish Council managed a very creditable record of work, and be fore completing its stewardship it was in the fortunate position of being able to reduce the Poor Rate by 1d per £1. In the textile industries employment has been steady, and several of the larger works have enjoyed seasons of very brisk The settlement of the affairs of the late Andrew Lowson caused eonsiderable anxiety amongst many of his employees; the whole of the works have now, however, been taken over by a limited liability company constituted under the name of Andrew Lowson, Ltd., (capital £50,000), at the head of which is Mr A. D. Lowson so long associated with his father in the direction of the business. Mr Lowson has associated with him in the directorate several of the gentlemen who were heads of departments

under the late Mr Lowson, and the shares of the new company are largely held by members of Mr Lowson's family. The best wishes of the whole community will attend the new firm. The fact that the New Year holidays in the textile factories are being cut down this year to three days may be taken as an indicathis healthy condition of trade in department The Millgate Tanworks, belonging to the late Bailie town's industry. Lyon, have been acquired by Mr Samuel Fairweather, Abbey Leather Works. and under his energetic direction it is expected the business will be maintained and extended. There have been disputes amongst local engineers, ironmoulders, shoemakers, joiners, &e., but fortunately none of them assumed great proportions. Tailors and joiners have had their wages increased, and the shoemakers at the works of Provost Grant and Mr Samuel Fairweather were granted a reduction of hours.

The erection of new sawmills at Ladyloan, and the conversion of the business of The Sawmill Company into a limited liability company under the title of Messrs Charles Brown & Co., Ltd., (capital £25,000) are events of interest in the trade of the year. Several new mineral water manufactories have been started; this trade seems to be increasing very rapidly. There has been thriving trade during the year, too, in buying and selling publichouses. The Magistrates now make it a rule to make public the price paid in cases of sale of licensed premises; and the particulars given show that there must still be big profits in "the trade." Several old-established bars have changed hands during the year at handsome prices. The year has been one of great activity in the building trades. A very large number of new buildings have been erected in all parts of the town, and the new year opens with the promise of continued activity in this direction. The line fishermen have had a poor year, and the herring fishing at Arbroath was a failure. The Harbour Revenue for the year shows a considerable decrease, the Trustees finding themselves under the necessity of drawing upon their reserve fund in order to pay the bondholders their 3 per cent dividend Special mention must be made of the change of the Wednesday half-holiday closing hour to one o'clock. change was carried out with a unanimity which did very great credit to the shopkeepers of the town. .

In educational matters the year has been one of most important changes The School Board has found itself very fully occupied in discussing matters connected with school organisation, property. &c. The Technical School at the High School is now open, and classes have been formed which in time are likely to be of distinct service in connection with various industries in the community. At the High School the results of the Leaving Certificate, and Art and Science examinations were all regarded as highly satisfactory. The medallists for the year were:-Latin-Mary S. Lilley; English-Mary S. Lilley; Mathematics-Lillian S. Ross; Writing-David Ducat; French-Mary S. Lilley; German-Mary S. Lilley; Science-John E. M'Gillvray; Golf (boys)—David A. Hutchison; (girls)—Agnes Campbell. In the elementary schools the teachers are engaged in the task of taking advantage of the revised regulations of the Education Department, and the School Board is doing what it can to advise parents regarding the new Labour and Merit Certificates, and to persuade them all to keep their children at school as long as possible. 'A strong effort is also being made to get rid of Friday afternoon absenteeism, an evil which has been growing very markedly of late. There have been several changes amongst teachers. Mr W. Grant was appointed headmaster of Ladyloan Public School, succeeding Mr Alex. Kydd, who died early in the year. Mr Dennler was appointed Master of Modern Languages in the High School in place of Mr Grant. Mr James Cox succeeded Mr L. H. Duff as schoolmaster at St Vigeans, Mr Cox's headmastership at Carmyllie passing to Mr W. F. Anderson, Arbroath. A considerable number





signified their approval of Union. Principal Rainy visited Arbroath in November and addressed a meeting of Free Church office-bearers on the question. Free Inverbrothock Church received, under the will of the late Mrs Sutherland, bookseller, a handsome bequest which will wholly relieve the congregation of the debt resting upon its fine church buildings at Hopemount. Memorial windows are being erected in the church in memory of members of Mrs Sutherland's family, money having been left by Mrs Sutherland for this purpose. Bazaars and sales of work continue as popular as even as money-raisers for kirks and kindred institutions. St Margaret's Women's Guild, £87; Abbey Parish Church, £87; St Ninian's £20; Ladies' Clothing Society, £617; Knox's Free Church, £38; St Mary's Episcopal Church, £140; Town Mission, £54; Inverbrothock Woman's Guild, £114; Princes Street United Presbyterian Church, £45; these are sums which have been raised for congregational, missionary, and other benevolent purposes during the year by means of sales of work, &c. It may be mentioned here that St Thomas Lodge of Free Masons, No. 40, raised considerably over £600 by its bazaar organised to pay off its hall debt and to establish a benevolent fund.

The Young Men's and the Young Women's Christian Associations have maintained creditable activity in all their departments of work during the year; under Mr Moffat, the Town Mission continues to do excellent Christian service. The Mission celebrates its Jubilee in January 1899, and its Directors have resolved that that celebration shall include the clearance of what remains of debt upon the Mission Buildings. May they succeed in their commendable effort! The Sabbath School Teachers' Union has been resusci-







Andrew Douglas made an earnest appeal for greater public interest in the Association and its work, and for more liberal support, especially from the younger gentlemen in the community.

The miscellaneous history of the year includes nothing of outstanding interest. A great storm visited the district in the middle of October. Norwegian vessels were wrecked-one at the Sands opposite Hospitalfield, and the other at Danger Point. Members of the Lifeboat Crew and the Life-Saving Brigade showed considerable bravery in saving life, and the Royal National Lifeboat Institution has awarded a vellum certificate to Coxswain Certain difficulties experienced in connection with the Smith of the lifeboat. management of the lifeboat have resulted in the Lifeboat Institution determining to provide a new, up-to-date lifeboat for Arbroath. The local companies of the Artillery Volunteers and Angus Rifles have both had very successful years, the annual inspections of both detachments calling forth strong praise from the inspecting officers. The Arbroath United Cricket Club had a fairly successful season, playing 23 matches, of which 10 were won, 6 lost, and 7 drawn. All the younger cricket clubs had a lively season. The Arbroath Football Club has revived popular enthusiasm by fine play in the Scottish and Forfarshire ties this season. Not for years has the team been so popular in town. In bowling, Newgate Club distinguished itself both in the Forfarshire Rink Tournament, and in the matches for the Forfar, Fife, and Perth Challenge The Newgate gained second place in both competitions. An interesting presentation to Mr Andrew Bennet, solicitor, by Newgate Club, to which, as secretary, he has done an immense amount of valuable service, must also be Bailie Herald, president, on behalf of the members, presented Mr Bennet with a handsome study chair and revolving bookcase. The establishment of a new Swimming Club, the St Thomas, gave a great interest to aquatic sport, and a swimming gala held by the St Thomas proved a most successful display. The new interest in swimming was considerably stimulated too by well-deserved awards to Mr James Cables, Mr Enoch Bell, and Mr D. Stewart for gallantry in efforts to save life at the Cliffs and Sands. Three deaths by drowning mark this year's record of accidents. A lad named Graham was drowned at the Cliffs; a lad named Anderson was drowned while bathing in the harbour; and a ploughman wandered down to the docks on the night of Saturday, 6th August, and was found drowned on Sunday morning. Mention must also be made of the Highland Gathering held at Seaton in August. Several excellent horse races proved a great attraction. The Angus Agricultural Show came off at Hospitalfield in July, and proved one of the most interesting and successful ever held under the Angus Association's auspices.

The community goes forward to 1899 with fair prospects before it, There are troublous public questions to deal with, and unwise views of them to eradicate; but time and consideration will solve these problems. Looking back upon yesterday with cheerfulness and gratitude, and forward to to-morrow with confidence, we heartily wish every reader of the Arbrouth Herald and the Year Book

Arbroath Educational Trust.—This Governing Body, constituted under the Educational

Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, deals with the educational endowments under the Gibson Fund, the Colvill Mortification, Dove's Charity, Rickards Legacy, and the Funds of the Female Benevolent Society. The scheme constituting the Trust provides that the Colvill Mortification Trustees shall pay to the Trust the sum of £60 yearly, and the Trustees of the Gibson Fund shall pay £100 yearly, and in the event of the annual revenue of the Gibson Fund exceeding £1050, that not exceeding one-half of such excess shall be paid over to the trust, in addition to the annual payment of £100. For the promotion of higher education the School Board of Arbroath shall receive from the Trustees £120 yearly, exclusive of the sum provided to be paid them out of the Morgan (Dundee) Trust for a like purpose, in respect of which eight poor boys, to be elected by the Governors, shall receive higher education gratuitously. Should such payment cease, the sum of £120 shall be devoted to bursaries of from £15 to £20 each yearly, and tenable for a period not exceeding four years at a University or technical school—these to be exclusively for behoof of pupils from schools in the burgh. £60 yearly shall be applied to bursaries of from £5 to £10 yearly, to be called the Colvill or Dove Bursaries, tenable for two years at higher class schools, candidates to have passed the fifth standard and be pupils from schools within that area and the parish of St Vigeans, who require aid in obtaining such education. The residue of the income, which will include £40 provided for free elementary education shall be devoted for behoof of the last-mentioned class of pupils from schools within the Presbytery district of Arbroath, to bursaries, to be called Gibson Bursaries, of from £10 to £15 yearly, and tenable for three years—candidates not to exceed fourteen years of age.
