It looked as if a double overtime would be necessary, since both teams seemed unable to score. Finally a Greene Central player fouled Farmville's Al Drake. Al tossed in the free throw and the Devils emerged triumphant by a score of 59 to 58.

The team has proved to be a good representative of the school as it displayed the sportsmanship and fair play of a truly great team.
