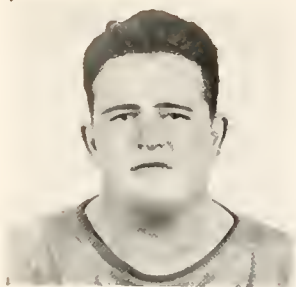
This year Robert Tyson is the president. It has one of the largest list of members this year ever to appear on the rolls.

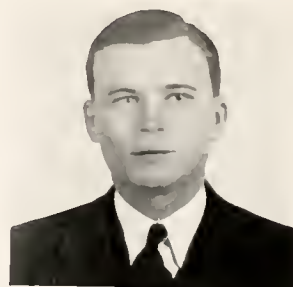

THE FOOTBALL SQUAD reported early and the practice was begun in earnest during the second week in September. Only two lettermen reported from last year's squad. They were quarterback Kenneth Welsh and Captain "Rusty" Helleckson at Guard. The team, which was composed of a strong line and one of the fastest backfields in the conference was handicapped by an injury jinx which seemed to follow them through the entire season. Davidson Freshmen, Wingate, Campbell, Boiling Springs, Mars Hill, Belmont-Abbey, and Brevard College's were met in that order.

All prospects point to a strong team next fall.

BASKETBALL

WITH three lettermen from last year's varsity returning this year, Coach Hand had a strong nucleus around which to build a team. Best at center, Welsh and Boyd at the guard positions and Cromartie and Helleckson usually constituted the starting line-up. The rest of the squad was composed of McSwain, Covington, Reid, Anderson, and Luis.

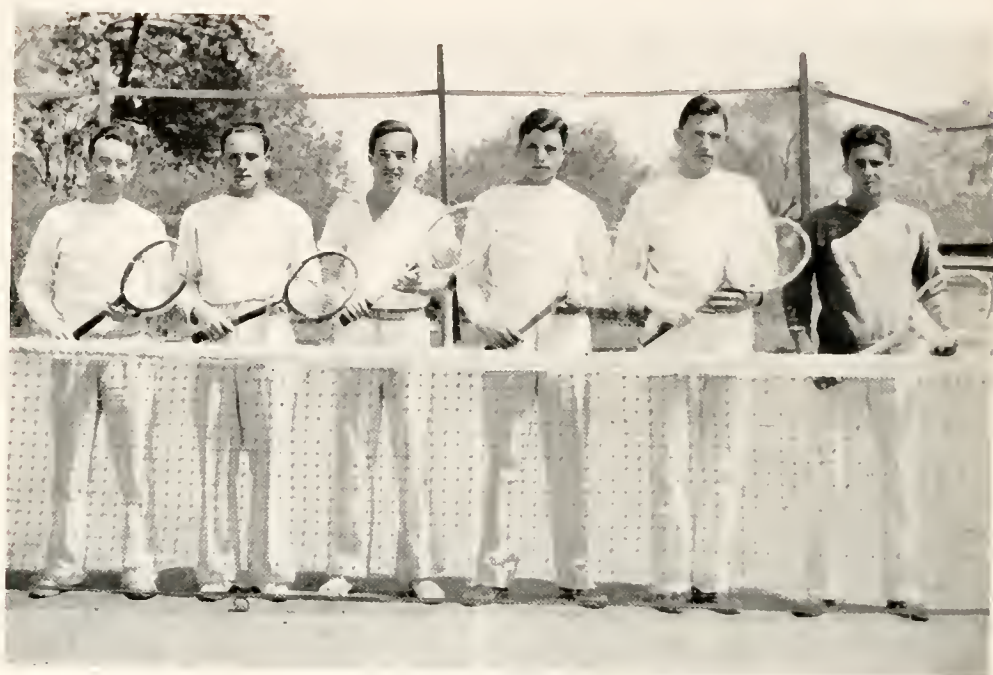

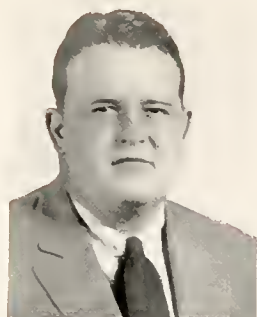

The Fighting Scots are known on the field for those fine characteristics which are instilled in them by the coaching staff, to fight hard and to fight clean.

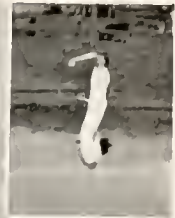
