## GLEE CLUB



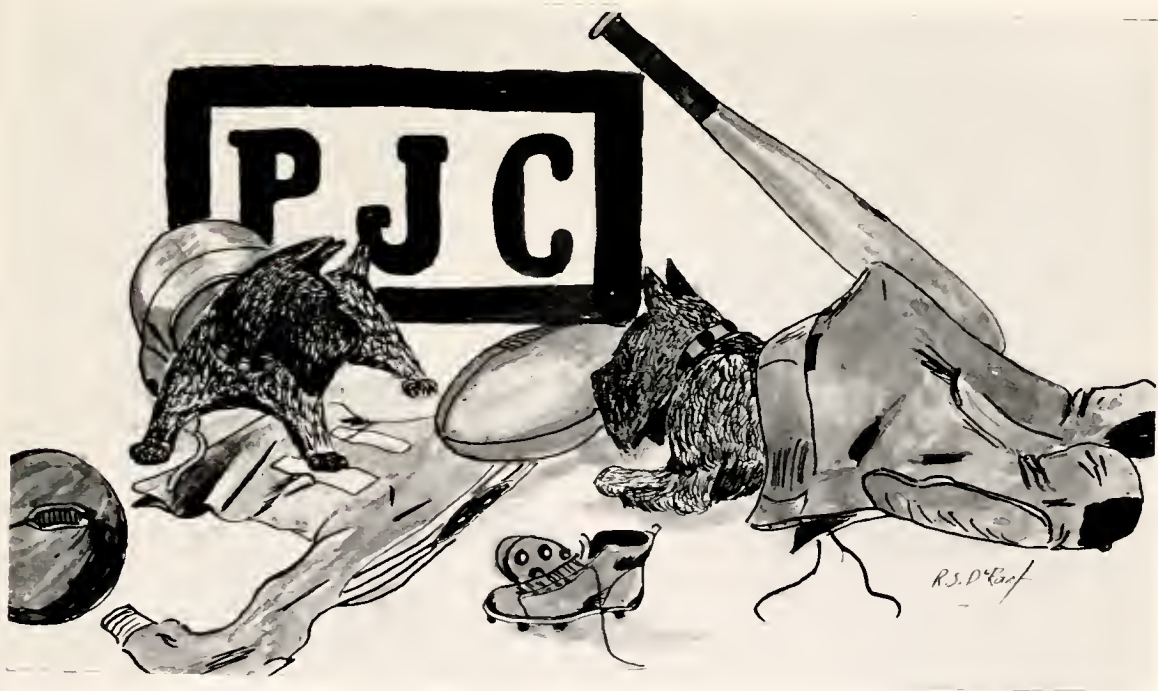
