Preparatory Courses On Middle East Tour

Junior College, a special feature during the summer of 1958 will be a College Credit Study Tour through the Middle East, including considerable time spent in the Holy Land. Preparatory courses will begin at Presbyterian Junior College on June 9 and college courses will begin June 16.

The Presbyterian Junior College-Lafayette College Middle East College Credit Study Tour will leave Idlewild Airport on Friday, July 4. Students of Presbyterian Junior College or any other college may take the trip to receive college credit by assisting in the Summer school. Any adults may accompany the party as auditors and artists without taking the courses for credit. Two courses (at least 54 hours each) will be given. The Middle East Tour will emphasize social, political, and economic problems in this rapidly changing and dynamic world-theater of events. The course on "Middle East Civilization" will treat of the historical background in the geographical setting where ancient civilizations developed. Attention will be given to the great contribution made by the Hebrew, Christian, and Greek cultures to our modern way of life. Biblical archaeology will receive attention, and it is planned to take a trip to the ruins of the Samran community which preceded the Dead Sea scrolls. Countries included in the study
