Drove around local roads from
 Thornhurst to Blessing and back,
 probably 35 or so miles of driving.
 The eyes of deer in fields and open
 woods. Counted does and fawns
 and bucks to try and get at
 relative numbers of each and in
 most cases could tell at a glance
 but fawns were so far away in
 the brush so we could not be
 sure which they were.
 All were in perfect condition
 plump and smooth and well
 fed in appearance and there
 is great abundance of food
 of the choicest kinds.
 The 23 does, 14 fawns, 5 bucks
 and 4 indeterminate were listed.
 One buck had good sized horns, two had
 small horns with about 3 or four points and
 two small spikes, not yet of spreading age.
 This leaves one good and two poor bucks for 23 does.
