To sum it all up, we felt that no trip could have been better.

With deepest enthusiasm, we returned in the fall of 1956 to take up the responsibility of being a Senior. Realizing that this was our final year here at Dear Ole Dunbar to prepare ourselves for leadership in the world, we resolved to make it our most profitable year. Our class officers for '56 and '57 are President Clarence Hailey, Vice President LeRoy Peay, Secretary Nella Ree Austin, Assistant Secretary Jennie Davis, Corresponding Secretary Irene Williams, and Treasurer William Barbour. Olivia White is President for the Student Council, with James Ford as representative.
