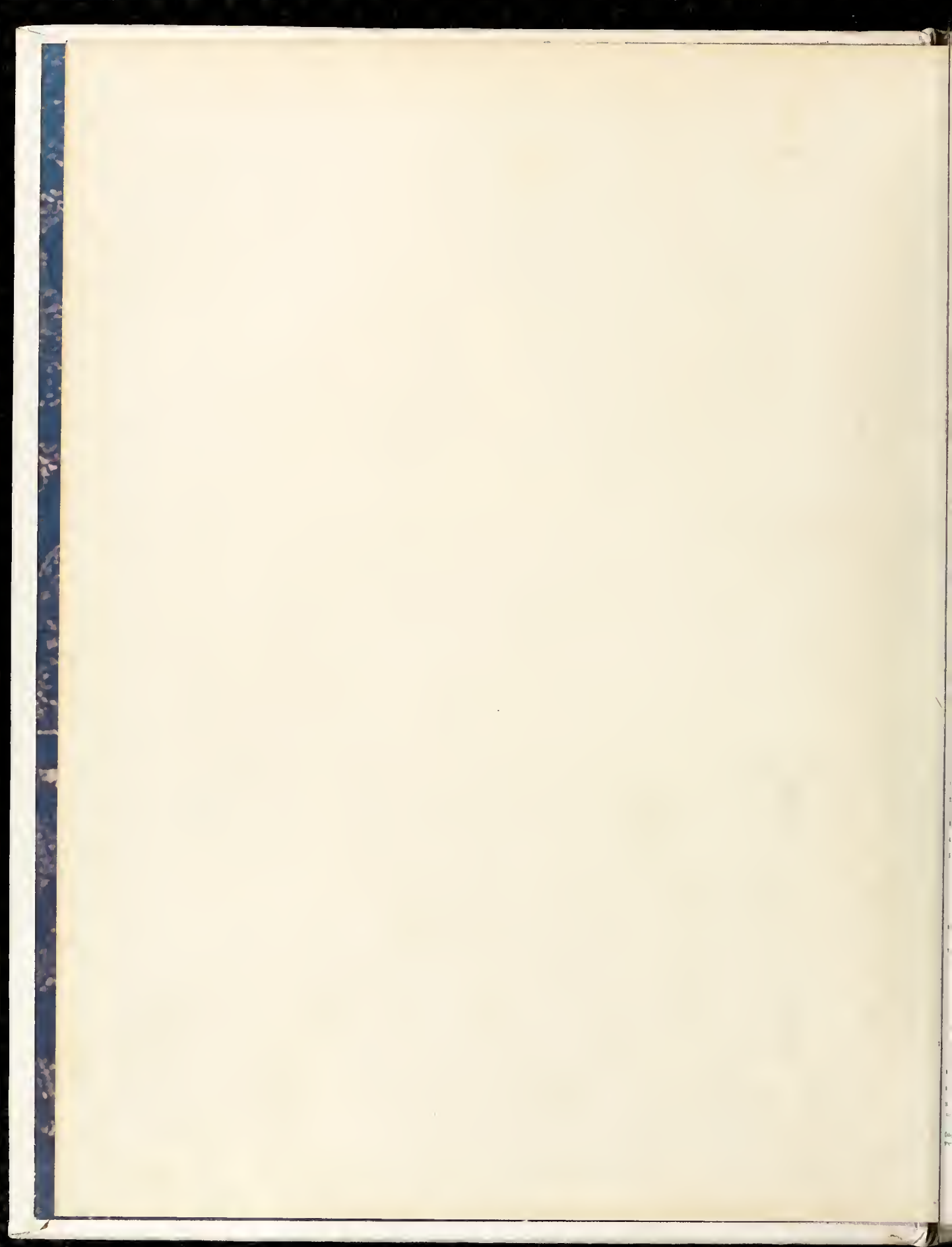

  - A. Applicants for all full time or part time day and evening programs EXCEPT Associate Degree Nursing, Practical Nurse Education, and Cosmetology, must complete the self report health form.
  - B. Associate Degree Nursing, Practical Nursing, and Cosmetology applicants must complete a regular health form of physical examination.
  - C. No physical education courses can be taken without the completion of the self report health form.
  - D. Practical Nursing applicants do not complete the physical examination more than thirty (30) days prior to the quarter of enrollment.
  - E. Associate Degree Nursing applicants are required to have a chest x-ray.
8. Practical Nursing applicants should request appraisal forms from the Admissions Office.
9. Cosmetology applicants must request additional examination forms from the Admissions Office.
10. Additional questionnaires will be forwarded at the time the Admissions Office is in receipt of the application.
