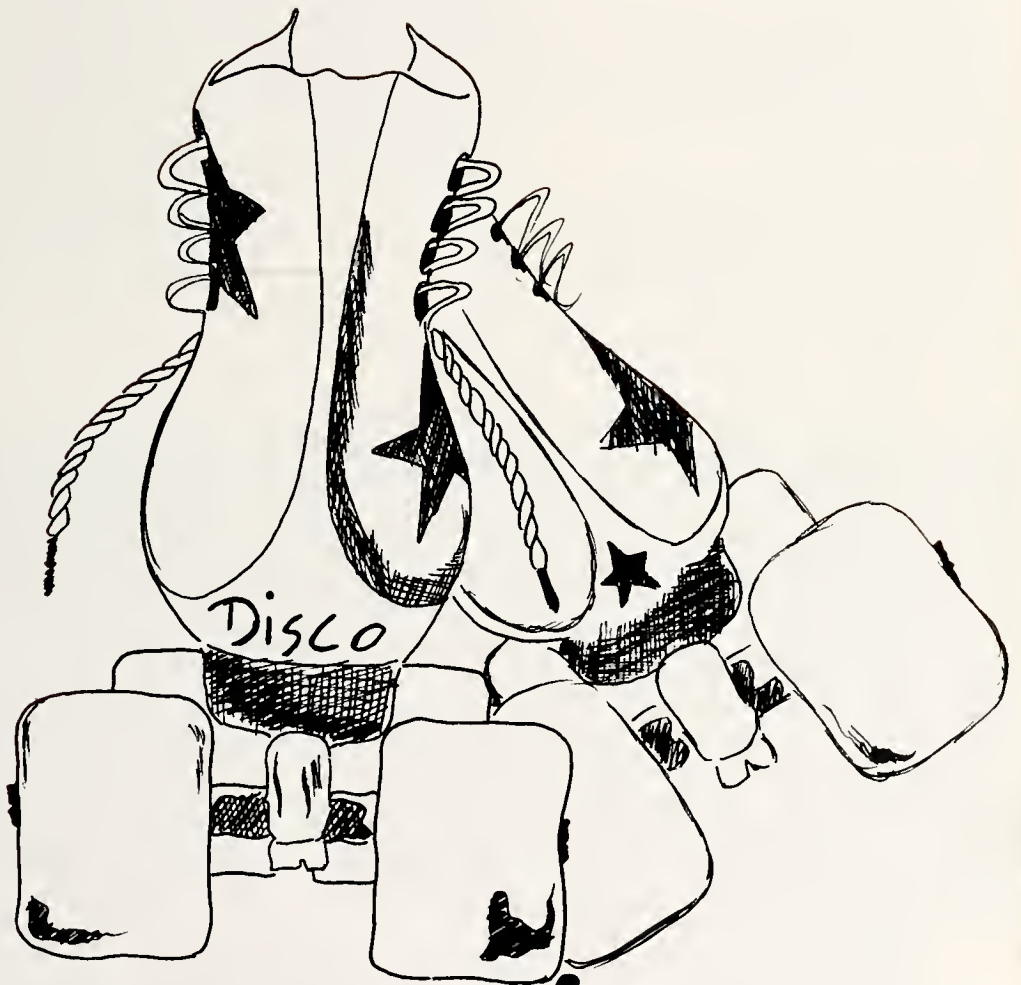












# HAPPENINGS

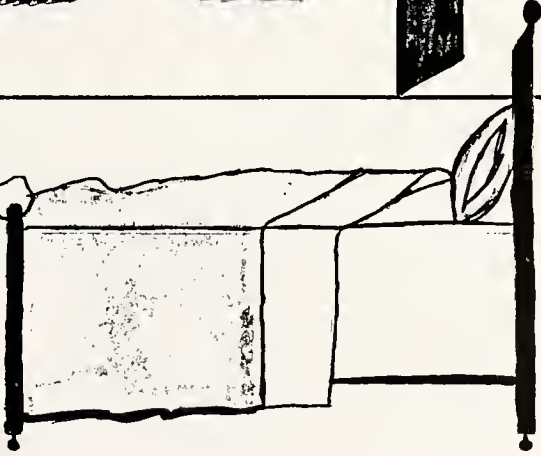

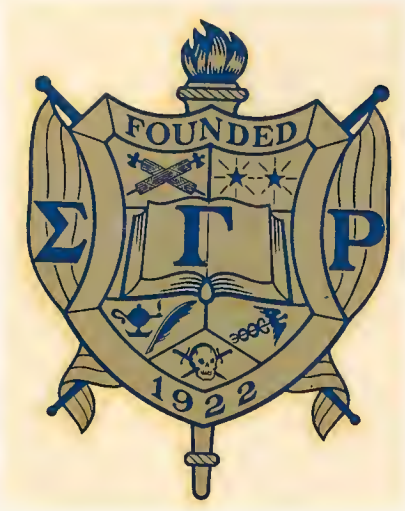

To the class of 1980, I dare you to continue to move upward and never give up. Continue to carry the name of Shaw University with dignity, pride, love and respect throughout this nation.


