

Shortly after our return to school as seniors, we elected Joyce Batts president. Later we sponsored the yearly Curtis Magazine subscription contest. The class sold \$1,728.05 worth of magazines. This topped all former classes of Elm City High. For selling the most magazines, Bobby Williams and Billy Smith received watches; for reaching the high total, the class received a Benjamin Franklin Plaque.

Undertaking to publish a better Bear Trap was not an easy job. We feel, however, that our able staff has succeeded.

By this time we, the seniors of 1950, will have presented a senior play, will have taken our senior trip, and will have attended the Junior-Senior Banquet.

As our commencement draws near, we feel that our high school days have been memorable ones—full of work and play. To those who have helped make these happy memories, we wish to express our sincere appreciation. On behalf of all thirty-six seniors, I take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Braswell for her helpful guidance. To Mr. Fugate, and to all teachers, we wish to say, "Because of you, we are worthy of our motto, 'The will to do, the soul to dare'."




