



# HISTORY

When we returned to school as seniors, we were placed under the guidance of Mrs. Simpson. We elected Boyd Owens as our class president. Later we sponsored the Curtis Magazine subscription contest. The class sold \$1,393.00 worth of magazines. Linwood Braswell received a watch and Joyce Taylor received \$5.00 in magazine subscriptions for reaching the high total. The class received a Benjamin Franklin Plaque.

Undertaking to publish the BEAR TRAP was not an easy job. We feel, however, that we have succeeded.

By this time we, the seniors of 1951, will have presented a senior play, will have taken our trip to Washington, and will have attended the Junior-Senior Banquet.

As our commencement draws near, we feel that our high school days have been memorable ones—full of work and play. To those who have helped make those happy memories, I, on behalf of the Senior Class, take this opportunity to express our appreciation.


