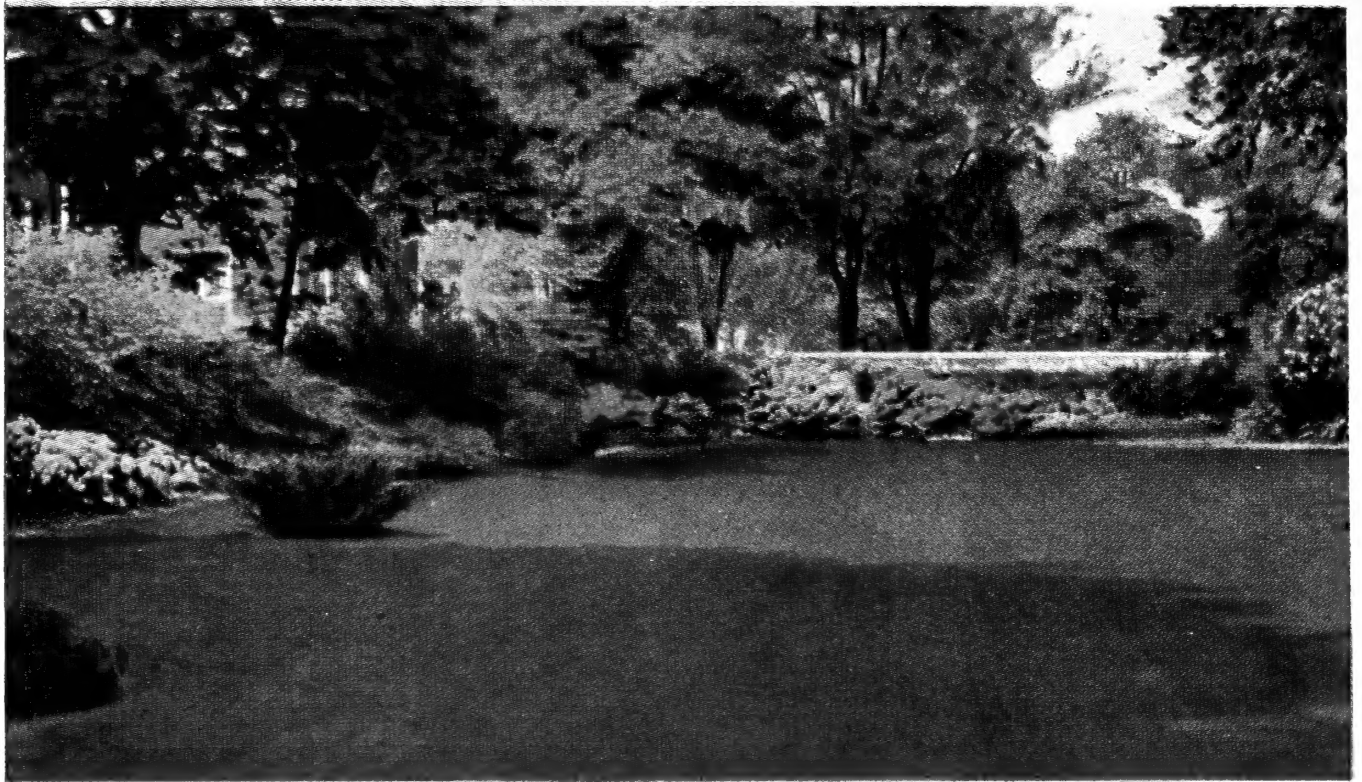

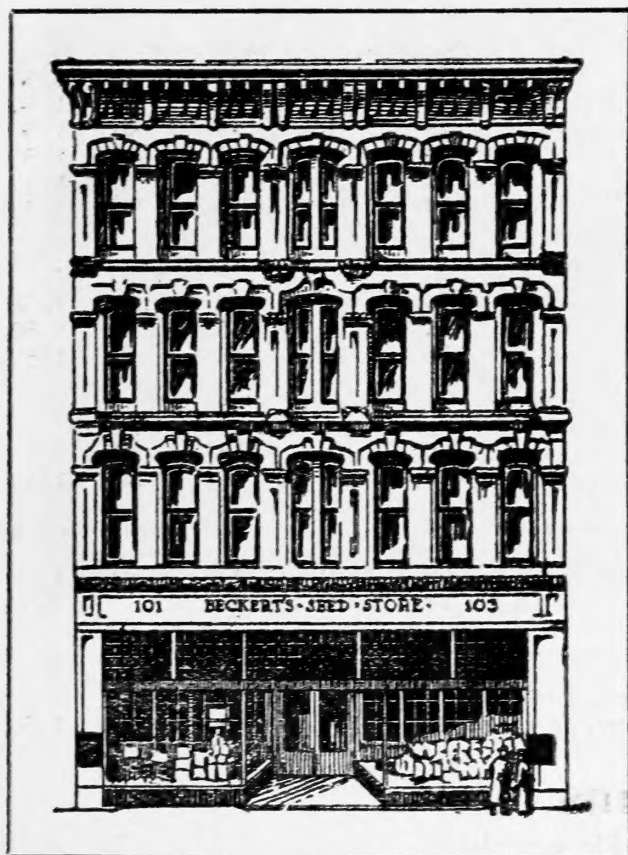

- SOY BEANS.** Sow in May or June. Can be plowed under or used for hay.

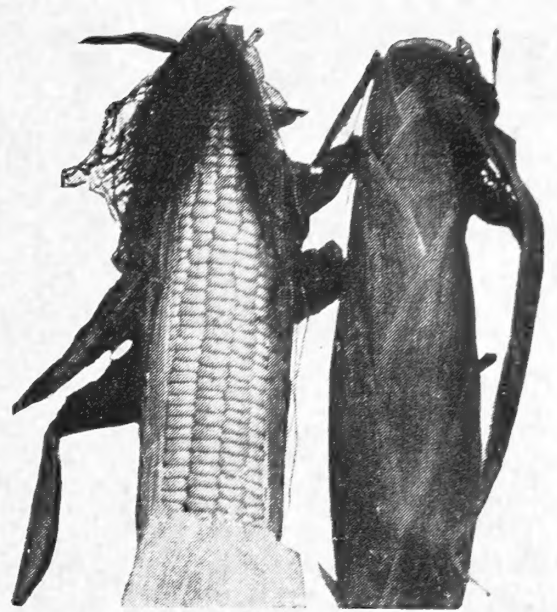

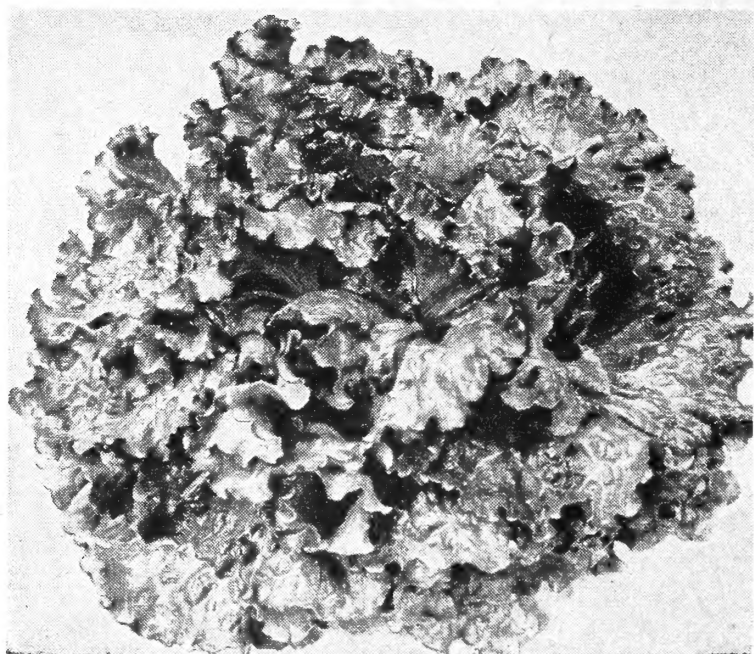
