Our teachers were: Miss Weathers our Homeroom, English and Algebra teacher; Mr. Koonce, Civics and Mr. Fridgen our General Business teacher.

At last we are happy dignified Seniors. Our class has decreased to 11 students. With Miss Weathers and Mr. Koonce as our teachers, we are sure we will succeed.

We left those halls of knowledge but carried with us memories of twelve wonderful years of work and play shared together.
