




The college sponsored one of the most relevant conferences in its history as a college for women. The three day event, Oct. 17-19, "A Socio-Cultural History of the Black Woman in America: Three Perspectives: Traditional, Feminist and Ethnographic," featured noted scholars.

Coordinated by the Bennett Scholars and the Divisions of Education, Humanities and Social Sciences. The featured keynoters were Margaret Walker Alexander, poet, novelist and educator; Paula Giddings, editor-at-large and book review editor, Essence Magazine; and activist, author and educator.

Classrooms became the sites for lively scholarly presentations and discussions on issues of unique concern to black women. Presenters represented universities and colleges from across the country.











the banquet included alumna Mae Cynthia Lee and A.H. Peeler whose father was a former president of the college. Dr. John McWhorter keynoted the convocation.




























HONORARY DEGREE
