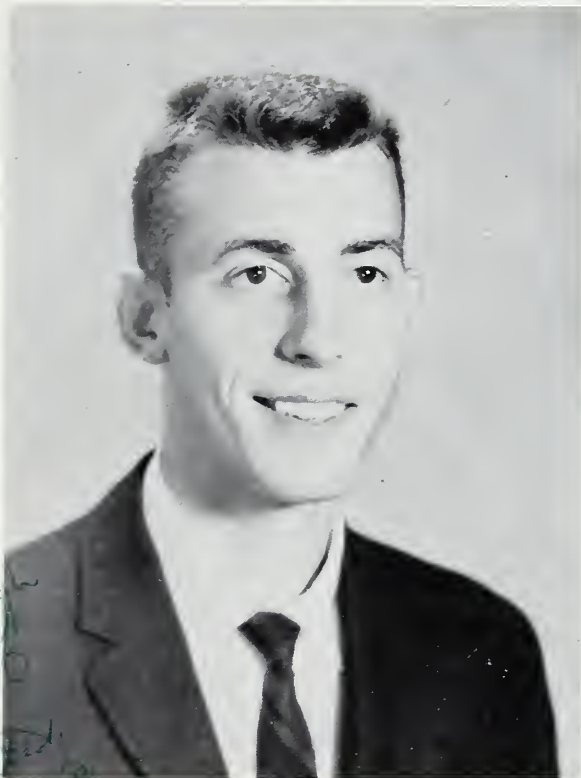
Foreword
