Julia Clark was also honored to be elected the Homecoming Queen to represent the school in the Morganton parade. Also we had a young man, William Whisnant, to become a father of a son, Tony Eugène. This year we presented a play by the name of "Cupid In Pigtails" which came as a success, much to the surprise of our director, Mr. Lowdermilk. Then came the event we were waiting for, the receiving of our class rings. We were all glad to receive them after working twelve years for them. The Junior-Senior was an event that we shall always remember. It was wonderful to be honored in this way.

Then came the day we were waiting for, our graduation day. We were sad at the thoughts of leaving our teachers and schoolmates, but we were all looking forward to the future with great hopes. of Oak Hill.

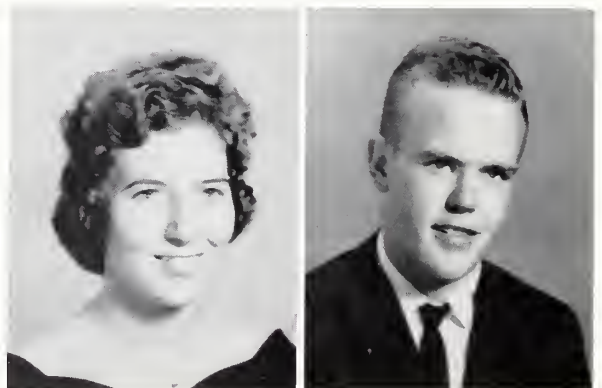
